APPOINTMENTS TO FILL VACANCIES IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF SUBSIDIARY BODIES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

BOARD OF AUDITORS

Report of the Fifth Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Brian J. LYNCH (New Zealand)

1. At its 1191st meeting, on 3 November 1967, the Fifth Committee considered a note by the Secretary-General (A/6683) concerning the vacancy in the membership of the Board of Auditors which will occur as a result of the expiration of the term of office of one of its members on 30 June 1968.
2. The members of the Fifth Committee were invited to make suggestions in regard to the country whose Auditor-General (or officer holding the equivalent title) might be recommended to the General Assembly for appointment as a member of the Board of Auditors. The Government of Canada presented the candidature of its Auditor-General for this position.
3. To decide on its recommendations to the General Assembly, the Committee voted by secret ballot. The result of the voting was as follows:

4. The Auditor-General of Canada, having received the required majority, was declared recommended for appointment as a member of the Board of Auditors for a three-year term beginning on 1 July 1968.
