APPOINTMENTS TO FILL VACANCIES IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF SUBSIDIARY BODIES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

BOARD OF AUDITORS

Report of the Fifth Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Brian J. LYNCH (New Zealand)

- 1. At its light meeting, on 3 November 1967, the Fifth Committee considered a note by the Secretary-General (A/6683) concerning the vacancy in the membership of the Board of Auditors which will occur as a result of the expiration of the term of office of one of its members on 30 June 1968.
- 2. The members of the Fifth Committee were invited to make suggestions in regard to the country whose Auditor-General (or officer holding the equivalent title) might be recommended to the General Assembly for appointment as a member of the Board of Auditors. The Government of Canada presented the candidature of its Auditor-General for this position.
- 3. To decide on its recommendations to the General Assembly, the Committee voted by secret ballot. The result of the voting was as follows:

4. The Auditor-General of Canada, having received the required majority, was declared recommended for appointment as a member of the Board of Auditors for a three-year term beginning on 1 July 1968.

RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

5. The Fifth Committee therefore recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

Appointment to fill a vacancy in the membership of the Board of Auditors

Appoints the Auditor-General of Canada as a member of the Board of Auditors for a three-year term beginning on 1 July 1968.
