RESOLUTION CONCERNING OF THE CONFIRMOR AT CHMSVA.

WHEREAS the evil of epium is universally recognized and condemned by all civilized peoples;

WHEREAS the League of Nations is conducting an opium ioncerence at Geneva to consider effective measures for the eradication of this universal evil:

WHEREAS the Chinese povernment has been represented at their opium conference;

Bo it resolved:

That it be made known to the entire world by the Chinese delogates to this conference that the cultivation, manufacture and smoking of opium were imposed on Chine as the result of her defeat in a righteous war of 1942 and that the Chinese people are desirous of ridding themselves and the world of this evil:

That the Chinese delegates to this conference urge the Lergus of Nations to devise means to sto the importation and smuggling of opium into China through channels over with the Chinese government exercises no control;

That the Chinese delegates to this conference urge the League of Nations to denounce the malicious propaganda fostered by certain Powers that China is exporting opium to other nations;

That the Chinese delegates to this conference pledge on behalf of the Chinese government and people, their untiring efforts at ending the opium evil in China and their co-operation with other peoples toward the same end;

That unreserved support, moral or otherwise, be extended to the League of Rations by the Chinese Students Alliance in the United States of America and by the Chinese Students Christian Association in America in so fer as its elects are directed, in an impartial manner, toward a thorough investigation of the opium question throughout the world and toward devising constructive measures for the permenent eradication of this evil; and

That unreserved support, moral or otherwise, be extended to the Chinose delegates to this conference by the Chinese Students' Alliance in the United States of America and by the Chinese Students' Christian Association in America;

Be it further resolved:

That a copy of these resolutions be sent to the opium conference through the League of Nations: and

That another copy of the same resolutions be sent to the Chief Chinese delegate to this conference for the information of himself and his associates.
