PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION OF 13 JULY 1931 FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS, AS AMENDED BY THE PROTOCOL OF 11 DECEMBER 1946

SOUTHERN RHODESIA

Communicated by the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL -- In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative texts.

Pharmacy, Poisons and Dangerous Drugs (Southern Rhodesia) Order, 1954

SCHEDULE (Section 3)

F.G.N. No. 180, 30th June, 1954.]

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor-General has been pleased, in terms of the Territorial Laws Amendment Act, 1954, to order as follows:--

1. This order may be cited as the Pharmacy, Poisons and Dangerous Drugs (Southern Rhodesia) Order, 1954.

2. With effect from the 1st July, 1954, all the provisions of the Pharmacy, Poisons and Dangerous Drugs Act, 1952, of Southern Rhodesia (hereinafter called the specified law) shall be administered by the Federal Government.

3. Any reference in the specified law to a word or words in the first column of the Schedule shall be read and construed as a reference to the word or words placed opposite thereto in the second column of the said Schedule.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph (v) of paragraph (b) of section 4 of the Act, the reference in subsection (3) of section 31 of the specified law to the Government of the Colony shall continue to be read and construed as a reference to the Government of Southern Rhodesia.

5. The specified law is hereby amended as follows--

(a) in subsection (1) of section 2 by the repeal of the definition of "Minister";

Dangerous Drugs (Amendment) Regulations, 1954 (No. 2)

F.G.N. No. 193, 30th June, 1954.]

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor-General has been pleased, in terms of the

Pharmacy, Poisons and Dangerous Drugs Act, 1952, of Southern Rhodesia, as amended and adapted, to make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Amendment) Regulations, 1954 (No. 2), and shall come into operation on the 1st July, 1954.

2. Any reference in the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, published in Southern Rhodesia Government Notice No. 96 of 1953 (hereinafter called the principal regulations) to a word or words in the first column of the Schedule to these regulations shall be read and construed as a reference to the word or words placed opposite thereto in the second column of the said Schedule.

3. The Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Schedules to the principal regulations are hereby amended in the prescribed forms, by the omission in each case of the heading "Southern Rhodesia" and by the substitution of the heading "Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland" in place thereof.

4. (1) Notwithstanding the amendment of the forms prescribed in the Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Schedules to the principal regulations by these regulations, the forms as prescribed in the

said Schedules immediately before the date of the coming into operation of these regulations may be used until existing stocks thereof are exhausted.

(2) Any such form so used on or after the date of the coming into operation of these regulations shall be accepted for all purposes as if such form had been amended in terms of these regulations.
