APPLICATION OF PART III OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1955

WHEREAS it appears to the Minister of Health that the drug listed in the schedule to this notice (not being a drug specified in the First Schedule to the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1955) is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

NOW, THEREFORE, in the exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (2) of section 10 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1955, the Minister of Health hereby applies Part III of the Act to such drug in the same manner as it applies to drugs specified in the First Schedule to the Act.

DANGEROUS DRUGS (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1963 (No.4)

IT is hereby notified that the Minister of Health has, in terms of section 12 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 19551, made the following regulations:

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Amendment) Regulations, 1963 (No.4).
- 2. Section 2 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1956², published in Federal Covernment Notice No. 59 of 1956 (hereinafter called the principal regulations), is amended in subsection (1) by the repeal of the definition of "veterinary surgeon" and by the substitution therefor of the following definition:
 - ""veterinary surgeon" means a person registered under the Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1961;".
- 3. Section 28 of the principal regulations is amended by the repeal of subsection (2) and by the substitution therefor of the following subsection:
 - "(2) For the purposes of paragraph (b) of subsection (1)
 - (a) any ester, ether or derivative specified in item (41) of the Fourth Schedule shall be treated as including its salts and any preparation containing any such ester, ether or derivative or its salts;
 - (b) any substance specified in items (46) to (72) of the Fourth Schedule shall be treated as including its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of the substance or its salts.".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations add a number of items to the list of Part III drugs and preparations for which separate pages are required to be used in the registers kept by persons authorized or licensed to supply such drugs and preparations.

The regulations also provide a new definition of a veterinary surgeon, following the enactment of the Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1961.

APPLICATION OF PART III OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1955

WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Minister of Health that a decision with respect to the product specified in the Schedule to this notice (being a product mentioned in section 13 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1955) has, in pursuance of article 11 of the Geneva Convention (No.2), been communicated by the Secretary-General of the United Nations to the parties to the said Convention:

NOW, THEREFORE, in the exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1955, the Minister of Health hereby applies Part III of the Act to the product specified in the Schedule to this notice, with the modification that such product shall not be treated as a drug to which Part III of the Act applies for the purposes of Part II of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1956 3/, published in Federal Government Notice No.59 of 1956.

Nicocodine^{2/}

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

The effect of this notice is that <u>nicocodine</u> ceases to be subject to the control imposed by Part II of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1956, and is instead made subject to the control imposed by Part III of those regulations, which is less strict, in particular in that the control of sale and distribution applies only in the case of wholesale dealers, and in that there is no restriction on possession of a drug in a quantity not exceeding one pound.

DANGEROUS DRUGS (SECTION 13 EXEMPTION) NOTICE, 1963 (No.4)

IN the exercise of the powers conferred by section 13 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1955, the Minister of Health, being satisfied that the product specified in the Schedule is of medical or scientific value, hereby directs as follows:

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Section 13 Exemption) Notice, 1963 (No.4).
- 2. The provisions of section 13 of the Act shall cease to apply to the product specified in the Schedule, being a product obtained from morphine, one of the phenanthrene alkaloids of opium.

Nicocodine²

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This notice exempts <u>nicocodine</u> from the provisions of section 13 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1955, which prohibits the trading in, or manufacture for the purposes of trade of any products obtained from any of the phenanthrene alkaloids of opium.
