Note by the Secretary-General

INTERNATIONAL CONVENTIONS AND PROTOCOLS IN THE FIELD
OF THE ENVIRONMENT

Report of the Executive Director

This document is submitted in response to General Assembly resolution 3436 (XXX) of 9 December 1975 and Governing Council decision 24 (III) of 30 April 1975. It reports on action taken pursuant to that Governing Council decision and decision 66 (IV) of 13 April 1976, gives information on developments in respect of conventions in the field of the environment received between 1 January and 28 November 1979, and outlines action taken to keep the Governing Council informed of the status of existing conventions and protocols.

I. INTRODUCTION

1. The General Assembly, in resolution 3436 (XXX) of 9 December 1975, expressed concern that existing international conventions or protocols in the field of the environment had not yet received the wide acceptance and application they deserved. It requested the Governing Council to keep the Assembly informed annually of any new conventions concluded in this field and of the status of existing conventions.

2. In decision 24 (III) of 30 April 1975, the Governing Council had already urged all States entitled to become parties to existing conventions and protocols in the field of the environment to do so as soon as possible. By the same decision, the Executive Director was requested to inform the Governing Council at each session of any new international conventions concluded in the field of the environment and of the status of existing conventions, with particular reference to ratifications, accessions and entry into force, as well as of the intention of various Governments to become parties to such conventions during the year of the Council's session. Section II of the present report contains information received between 1 January and 28 November 1979 on conventions which have recently entered into force or been concluded, and on the intention of Governments to ratify existing conventions. It also lists conventions currently being prepared. Section III outlines the action taken in response to Governing Council decisions 24 (III) and 66 (IV) of 30 April 1975 and 13 April 1976 respectively.

II. DEVELOPMENTS REGARDING THE STATUS OF CONVENTIONS

3. One international convention in the field of the environment other than those already recorded in document UNEP/GC/INFORMATION/5 and its Supplement 2 1/ came into force between 1 January and 28 November 1979:

Convention on the Conservation of Migratory Species of Wild Animals; Date of adoption, 23 June 1979. 2/

4. In reply to a letter which the Executive Director addressed to Governments on 7 June 1979, a number of Governments gave information on the extent of their participation in various existing conventions in the field of the environment. This information was used in up-dating documents UNEP/GC/INFORMATION/5 and Supplements.

5. In this connexion, the Government of Norway informed the Executive Director that among other conventions, Norway hoped to ratify in particular the Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (2 November 1973) in either December 1979 or January 1980.

6. The Government of Austria also indicated that the Parliament of Austria would shortly be considering the ratification, by the end of 1979, of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (3 March 1973).

7. The Government of Chile indicated fourteen conventions in the field of the environment which it had ratified.

8. The same Government further indicated that action was proceeding on the ratification of the following conventions:

Convention on Wetlands of International Importance Especially as Waterfowl Habitat, 2 February 1971

Convention for the Conservation of Antarctic Seals, 1 June 1972

Convention concerning the Protection of World Cultural and Natural Heritage, 23 November 1972

Convention on the Prohibition of the Development, Production and Stockpiling of Bacteriological (Biological and Toxin) Weapons and on their Destruction, 10 April 1972.

III. REGISTER OF INTERNATIONAL CONVENTIONS IN THE FIELD OF THE ENVIRONMENT

10. The Governing Council, in decision 66 (IV) of 13 April 1976, requested the Executive Director to continue the systematic collection, analysis and presentation of data and information relating to international conventions and agreements in the field of the environment.

11. To help Governments identify those environmental conventions to which they may be entitled to become parties as requested by the General Assembly in resolution 3436 (XXX), and to provide the Governing Council regularly with the information it requested in decisions 24 (III) and 66 (IV), a list of important international conventions adopted since 1933 in the field of the environment has been presented in documents UNEP/GC/INFORMATION/5 and Supplements 1, 2 and 3. This collection forms the nucleus of a UNEP register of international conventions in the field of the environment, which will be up-dated through a loose-leaf system and periodically consolidated in new editions. UNEP/GC/INFORMATION/5 and supplements will also be used by UNEP in identifying and helping to overcome the difficulties which prevent Governments from becoming parties to or implementing environmental conventions. 4/

IV. SUGGESTED ACTION BY THE GOVERNING COUNCIL

12. The Governing Council may wish to take note of the present report and authorize the Executive Director to transmit it, together with document UNEP/GC/INFORMATION/5/Supplement 3, to the General Assembly at its thirty-fifth session, in accordance with resolution 3436 (XXX).

PROTOCOL CONCERNING THE CONSTITUTION OF AN INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE SAAR AGAINST POLLUTION

Objectives

To protect the Saar River against pollution.

Provisions

(a) Establishment of the International Commission for the Protection of the Saar against Pollution;

(b) The Commission to be responsible for research into the nature, importance and sources of pollution, and to propose measures to the Parties to protect the Saar;

(c) The Commission to establish relations as necessary with other organizations concerned with water pollution.

Restricted to the two riparian signatory States.

CONVENTION ON THE CONSERVATION OF MIGRATORY SPECIES OF WILD ANIMALS

Objectives

To protect those species of wild animals that migrate across or outside national jurisdictional boundaries.

Provisions

- (a) Endangered migratory species to be listed in Appendix I;
- (b) Migratory species to be subject to agreements to be listed in Appendix II;
- (c) Agreements (international) should deal with those aspects of the conservation and management of the migratory species concerned which serve to achieve the object of protection;
- (d) Scientific council to be established to provide advice on scientific matters;
- (e) A secretariat to be established for the purpose of this convention.

Membership

Open for signature by all States and regional economic integration organizations until 22 June 1980. After this date, the convention shall be open for accession by non-signatory States and any regional economic integration organization.
