CORRIGENDUM

At the bottom of page 49 of document S/AC.4/1, insert the following:

INCIDENTS OF THE GREEK-ALBANIAN BORDER OF

13, 14 and 19 NOVEMBER 1946

- 62. 13 November 1946: At 6:00 p.m., Albanians attacked the Greek frontier post No. 12 (Zodi) with automatic rifles. They further shot flares.

 The Greeks abstained from returning the fire. The Greek post is located four kilometres south-west of Pondikates village.
- 63. 13 November 1946: At 11:00 p.m., the Albanians attacked with automatic rifles patrol No. 1 of the Greek post of Mavromati by surprise, while on-Greek territory and close to pyramid No. 70. The Greek patrol returned the fire. The Albanians fell back into their territory.
- 64. 14 November 1946: At 7:00 a.m., the Albanians set an ambush on Greek territory near the frontier line. From this spot they fired with automatic rifles against patrol No. 2 of the Greek post of Ierotics.

 A Greek private was wounded from the Albanian fire.
- 65. 19 November 1946: At 10:00 a.m., an Albanian patrol ambushed on Greek territory in the vicinity of pyramid 50, fired at a Greek patrol. The Greek patrol forced the Albanians to fall back into their territory.
- 66. 19 November 1946: At 8:00 a.m., a large band assailed frontier posts

 Nos. 22 (Papacosta) and 23 (Fritsi), each of which had a guard of seven

 men. They took away the arms and ammunition and disappeared in an

 unknown direction. The posts are at a distance of two kilometres from

 the Greek-Albanian frontier.

67. Thirty-three Greek families of the area of Korytsa were arrested and imprisoned. Among them is the lawyer Basil Kontis (aged over seventy), Raphael Proutanis and Achilles Funtos, apothecary. Also Thomas Siomos, Kosmas Kyrata (brother of the Bishop of Argyrokastro), Peter Kotolos and others whose names will be communicated later.
