

Chapter I

Organizational matters

A. Membership

1. Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 43/222 B, in 2018 the Committee on Conferences was composed of the following Member States: Austria, Botswana, Brazil, China, Ecuador, France, Germany, Ghana, Guyana, Hungary, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Iraq, Jamaica, Japan, Kenya, Liberia, Morocco, Nepal, the Russian Federation, Sierra Leone and the United States of America.

B. Officers

2. At its organizational session for 2018 (551st meeting), held on 23 April 2018, the Committee elected the following officers to serve in 2018:

C. Organization of work

- 3. At its organizational session, the Committee agreed to follow the guidelines adopted in 1994 and 1995 with regard to its consideration of intersessional departures from the approved calendar of conferences and meetings and to meet, as required, to review proposals affecting the schedule of conferences and meetings during sessions of the General Assembly.
- 4. At the same session, the Assistant Secretary-General for General Assembly and Conference Management addressed the Committee. The representatives of Ecuador and Guyana made statements.
- 5. The Committee held its substantive session from 4 to 10 September 2018 (552nd to 553rd meetings). At the opening of the substantive session, on 4 September, the Under-Secretary-General for General Assembly and Conference Management introduced the report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences (A/73/93). During the formal meetings, statements were made by the representatives of France, Ecuador, the Russian Federation and the United States.

D. Programme of work

6. At its organizational session for 2017 (547th meeting), held on 21 June 2017, the Committee requested the Secretariat to submit the provisional agenda for 2018 to the Committee at its organizational session for 2018. At its organizational session for 2018 (551st meeting), held on 23 April 2018, the Committee adopted the provisional agenda (A/AC.172/2018/L.1) and requested the Secretariat to submit a provisional

agenda for 2019 to the Committee at its organizational session for 2019. The Committee also decided to include in its programme of work for the year, prior to the Committee's substantive session or upon request, informal briefings by the Secretariat on issues of interest to Member States relating to conference management.

E. Participation of observers

7. Three Member States, namely, Cuba, Equatorial Guinea and Sierra Leone, were represented as observers at the organizational session of the Committee. One Member State, Cuba, was represented as an observer at the substantive session.

Chapter II

Meetings management

A. Adoption of the draft revised calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for 2019

8. At its 552nd meeting, on 4 September 2018, the Committee reviewed and adopted the draft revised calendar of conferences and meetings for 2019 (A/AC.172/2018/L.2).

B. Requests for exceptions to section I, paragraph 7, of General Assembly resolution 40/243

9. At the same meeting, the Committee considered the sections of the report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences (A/73/93, sect. II.A, and supplementary information, sect. I.A) containing information on the requests received for exceptions to section I, paragraph 7, of General Assembly resolution 40/243, by which the Assembly decided that no subsidiary organ of the Assembly might meet at United Nations Headquarters during a regular session of the Assembly unless explicitly authorized by the Assembly.

Conclusions and recommendations

- 10. The Committee recommended that the General Assembly explicitly authorize the following bodies to meet in New York during the main part of its seventy-third session, on the understanding that all such meetings would be allocated conference services on an "as available" basis, in such a way that the work of the Assembly and its Main Committees would not be impeded:
 - (a) Committee on Relations with the Host Country;
- (b) Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People;
- (c) Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme, the United Nations Population Fund and the United Nations Office for Project Services;
 - (d) United Nations Board of Auditors;
- (e) Panel of External Auditors of the United Nations, the Specialized Agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency;
 - (f) Independent Audit Advisory Committee.

C. Intersessional departures

- 11. The General Assembly, in its resolution 72/19, approved the draft biennial calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for 2018 and 2019, as submitted by the Committee on Conferences, and authorized the Committee to make any adjustments that might become necessary as a result of actions and decisions taken by the Assembly at its seventy-second session. The calendar was issued as A/AC.172/2018/2.
- 12. The Committee on Conferences approved the following requests:

- (a) Request from the Advisory Board on Disarmament Matters to convene its sixty-ninth session in Geneva rather than in New York, from 24 to 26 January 2018;
- (b) Request from the Chairs of the human rights treaty bodies to hold their 30th meeting in New York instead of in Geneva, from 28 May to 1 June 2018;
- (c) Request from the Independent Audit Advisory Committee to add an additional day to its forty-fourth session, and meet from 11 to 14 December 2018, to enable the United Nations system oversight committees to meet, hosted by the Committee in the context of its forty-fourth session;
- (d) Request from the Advisory Board on Disarmament Matters to convene its seventy-first session in Geneva rather than in New York, from 30 January to 1 February 2019.

D. Utilization of conference-servicing resources by United Nations organs

- 13. At its 552nd meeting, on 4 September 2018, the Committee on Conferences considered the section of the report containing an analysis of the utilization of conference-servicing resources by United Nations organs (A/73/93, para. 14, and supplementary information, sects. I.C and I.D).
- 14. The Chair said that, as in previous years, letters would be sent to the presiding officers of the calendar bodies whose utilization rate had fallen below the 80 per cent benchmark over the previous six years.

E. Provision of interpretation services to meetings of regional and other major groupings of Member States

15. At the same meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the provision of interpretation services to meetings of regional and other major groupings of Member States (A/73/93, paras. 16–17, and supplementary information, sect. I.D).

F. Utilization of the conference centre at the Economic Commission for Africa

16. Also at the same meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the utilization of the conference facilities at the Economic Commission for Africa (A/73/93, para. 18, and supplementary information, sect. I.C).

Chapter III

Documents management

A. Timely submission, processing and issuance of documents

17. At its 552nd meeting, on 4 September 2018, the Committee considered the section of the report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences concerning the timely submission, processing and issuance of documents (A/73/93, paras. 31-37).

Discussion

18. The representative of one delegation expressed a readiness to work with the Committee to address issues regarding the timely processing and issuance of documentation relating to the Fifth Committee. Another representative noted that the rising number of non-calendar meetings was placing the Department for General Assembly and Conference Management under growing strain.

B. Simultaneous issuance of documents

19. At the same meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the simultaneous issuance of documents (A/73/93, para. 45).

C. Digitization and uploading of important older United Nations documents

20. Also at the same meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the digitization and uploading of important older United Nations documents (A/73/93, para. 46).

Chapter IV

Staffing

21. At its 552nd meeting, on 4 September 2018, the Committee considered the section of the report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences concerning matters relating to workload and staffing (A/73/93, paras. 52–62, and supplementary information, sect. III).

Discussion

22. One representative expressed support for signing more memorandums of understanding with tertiary institutions, especially those which already had or planned to introduce training programmes for United Nations translators and interpreters. The main goal of initiatives to modernize and streamline the work of the language services should be to improve the quality of translation and interpretation in all six official languages. New technologies should be compatible with that aim and user-friendly in all the official languages. Maintaining high quality depended in large part on the provision of good working conditions and the even distribution of adequate staff and resources among all language services. The Secretariat should ensure the smooth transfer of knowledge from senior to junior staff. The representative supported the use of temporary staff, particularly in understaffed language services, in line with General Assembly resolution 72/19 on the pattern of conferences.
