Statement by the delegations of the Bulgarian People's Republic,
Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Republic of Cuba,
Socialist Republic of Czechoslovakia, Ethiopia,
German Democratic Republic, Hungarian People's Republic,
Mongolian People's Republic, Polish People's Republic,
Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, Union of Soviet Socialist
Republics and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

The delegations of the Bulgarian People's Republic, Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Republic of Cuba, Socialist Republic of Czechoslovakia, Ethiopia, German Democratic Republic, Hungarian People's Republic, Mongolian People's Republic, Polish People's Republic, Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam state that they do not consider as lawful the presence at the United Nations Conference on Prohibitions or Restrictions of Use of Certain Conventional Weapons which may be Deemed to be Excessively Injurious or to have Indiscriminate Effects of a person claiming to represent Kampuchea under the title of the so-called "Democratic Kampuchea". According to their wellknown position, the only existing Kampuchean State is the People's Republic of Kampuchea.
