PETITION FROM MR. ISSE ABDI HASSAN AND TWO OTHERS CONCERNING
SOMALILAND UNDER ITALIAN ADMINISTRATION

Note by the Secretary-General: In accordance with rule 85 and supplementary rules F and L of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council, the Secretary-General has the honour to transmit to the members of the Trusteeship Council, to the Government of Italy as the Administering Authority of the Trust Territory of Somaliland, and to the Governments of Colombia, Egypt, and the Philippines as members of the Advisory Council for the Trust Territory of Somaliland, a communication dated 8 February 1952 from Mr. Isse Abdi Hassan and two others concerning the Trust Territory of Somaliland under Italian administration.

have the honour to state as follows:

During the disorderness that occurred in Iscia Baidoa on the 24th of February 1950, the following stocks were looted from us by the Rahanuen of Iscia Baidoa.

Goats and sheeps 160

Camels 15

These stocks are valued at Shs. 7,260/-

We own witnesses and had reported both to the Police and the other authorities of the Italian Administration, but no action was taken. The Administration had promised to recompenza the individuals whose property were looted, but on a very few people were satisfied, and the rest are hanging about.

We call upon the United Nations Advisory Councils who interferred at first to grant us a legal aid which will enable us to gain back the recompensation of our property looted by the Rahanuen.

For doing the said favour, we shall ever remain grateful and pray almighty God to long your life and prosperity.
