I. Introduction

1. At its seventy-eighth session, the General Assembly adopted resolution 78/46, in which it decided to convene the fourth United Nations Conference to Review Progress Made in the Implementation of the Programme of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All Its Aspects in New York from 17 to 28 June 2024, to preceded by the meeting of the preparatory committee in New York, from 12 to 16 February 2024. The Assembly also underlined the importance of the full and effective implementation of the Programme of Action and the International Tracing Instrument for attaining Sustainable Development Goal 16 and target 16.4 of the 2030 Agenda Sustainable Development.

II. Organizational matters

A. Opening and duration of the session and list of participants

- 2. The Preparatory Committee held its session at United Nations Headquarters from 12 to 16 February 2024. The session was opened by the High Representative for Disarmament Affairs, who also made a statement. During the session, the Preparatory Committee held a total of [__] formal meetings.

Recommendation II Draft provisional rules of procedure of the Conference

The Preparatory Committee decides to recommend for adoption by the United Nations Conference to Review Progress Made in the Implementation of the Programme of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All Its Aspects the rules of procedure as contained in document A/CONF.192/2024/PC/2.

Recommendation III Nomination of the President of the Conference

The Preparatory Committee decides to unanimously recommend the candidacy of Maritza Chan Valverde of Costa Rica, the Chair of the Preparatory Committee, for the presidency of the fourth United Nations Conference to Review Progress Made in the Implementation of the Programme of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All Its Aspects.

The Preparatory Committee requests the President-designate to undertake informal consultations, including open-ended informal consultations, if required, in the period before the Conference.

Recommendation IV Nomination of the Secretary-General of the Conference

The Preparatory Committee decides to invite the Secretary-General of the United Nations, in consultation with Member States, to nominate an official to act as Secretary-General of the Fourth United Nations Conference to Review Progress Made in the Implementation of the Programme of Action to Prevent, Combat and Eradicate the Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in All Its Aspects.
