"The President, having noted that the debate which took place has its origin in a complaint presented by the representative of the United Kingdom in document $\mathrm{S} / 7442$ and that the elements on which the complaint is founded are contested by the United Arab Republic and Yemen and that the statements made by the members of the Council have not been able to produce at this stage a constructive solution, believes that he is authorized to ask the parties concerned each on his part to contribute in lessening the tension
