1. The SBSTA Chair, in consultation with representative experts from Parties should ensure that the deliverables of the Programme of Work, as set out above, pursues its objectives and outcomes as contained in the Annex to Decision 2/CP 11 and provide a solid basis for the implementation of the Five Year Programme of Work. These deliverables, as described above, should contain concrete information that will inform users at different levels on:

- (a) Analysis of the issues as addressed by the activity, including current status, and lessons learned;
- (b) Identifications of gaps, needs (including any capacity needs), barriers and constraints;
- (c) Options on ways and means on how to practically address identified needs and gaps.
- (d) Practical recommendations on how to implement the options identified in para c, by parties and users, at all levels
- 2. The SBSTA should request the secretariat, subject to the availability of resources, to widely disseminate by effective means, the deliverables resulting from the specific activities, to the appropriate target audiences.
- 3. The SBSTA should request the Secretariat, under the guidance of the Chair of the SBSTA, to prepare progress reports on the results of the activities undertaken, to be presented to SBSTA, at each meeting from SBSTA 25 through to SBSTA 27, in order that the SBSTA may begin to consider further activities as well as appropriate timing and modalities for their inclusion in the programme of work at SBSTA 28.
- 4. The SBSTA should the Secretariat, under the guidance of the Chair of the SBSTA, to prepare a summary progress report on the activities undertaken, with recommendations for further activities as well as appropriate timing and modalities, for consideration by SBSTA at its 28th session (June 2008) as provided in decision 2/CP11, para 6 (d).
- **5.** The SBSTA should request parties, before SBSTA 25, to submit to the Secretariate, suggested draft terms of reference for a group or groups of experts to provide technical advice and support in the implementation of the programme of work.
- 6. The SBSTA should request the Secretariate to synthesise these submissions for consideration by SBSTA 25 with a view to preparing a recommendation inviting the COP at its 12th session, to adopt a decision on the formulation of the work of this group or groups of experts.

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
