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#### Section 25. International Court of Justice

A. Members of the Court (Decrease: \$34,800)

#### Salaries and allowances of judges and related costs

25.1 A net surplus of \$34,800 is anticipated under this heading. Of this amount \$2,400 is attributable to inflation and \$4,300 to variations in the rates of exchange.

25.2 The net surplus shown under other changes in Table 25.2 above is attributable to lower pension payments than anticipated (\$72,900) and savings in travel and subsistence expenditures in connection with the designation of <u>ad hoc</u> judges (\$46,500). These savings were partly offset however by additional requirements in respect of journeys of judges to attend sessions of the Court (\$40,000), removal of household effects (\$2,800) and installation allowance (\$39,300) resulting from the revised travel and subsistence regulations of the Court as approved by the General Assembly in its resolution 37/240 with effect from 1 January 1983; the cost of other official journeys of the President and Members of the Court (\$7,600); and an increase under salaries and allowances of judges (\$1,600).

#### B. Registry

25.3 The net additional requirements under this heading are estimated at \$550,600.

25.4 That increase reflects additional requirements in respect of salaries due to a lower vacancy rate than that assumed in the standards (\$127,100); under temporary assistance for meetings and general temporary assistance due to a higher workload than anticipated (\$332,500;; overtime (\$51,500); common staff costs (\$42,400); and hospitality (\$500). These additional requirements were, however, partly offset by savings in travel of staff (\$3,400).

#### C. Administration and common services

25.5 A net surplus of \$53,900 is anticipated under this heading.

25.6 The net surplus of \$53,900 reflects lower requirements for external printing (\$69,900), rental and maintenance of premises (\$5,900), rental and maintenance of equipment (\$11,500), library books and supplies (\$3,400), furniture and equipment (\$900) and miscellaneous services (\$100), offset by additional requirements in respect of communications (\$25,900), and supplies and materials (\$11,900).

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
