Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the report of the 9th meeting of the Security Council's Committee on Membership in which the representative of France reserved the attitude of his Government in regard to Siam's application for membership as long as an agreement has not been reached on the procedure for the settlement of the territorial dispute.

I have the honour to confirm the statement of the representative of France that talks are at present under way and to state that the Siamese Delegation, who has already arrived in Washington, is confident that an agreement will be reached very soon on the procedure for the settlement of the territorial dispute.

Under these circumstances, therefore, I trust that favorable consideration will be given by the Security Council to Siam's application for membership when the matter is submitted to the Security Council.
