Standards of accommodation for air travel

Report of the Secretary-General

1. The present report covers travel undertaken during the period from 1 July 1988 to 30 June 1989. For this period, standards of accommodation for air travel were governed by General Assembly resolution 42/214 of 21 December 1987, which stipulated that all individuals, with the exception of the Secretary-General and the heads of delegations of the least developed countries to the regular and special sessions of the Assembly, whose travel was financed by United Nations organizations and programmes and who had previously been entitled to first-class accommodation, would be required to travel at the class immediately below first class. The resolution also stipulated that the Secretary-General was authorized to exercise his discretion in making exceptions to allow first-class travel on a case-by-case basis.

2. Bearing in mind the request contained in General Assembly decision 40/455 of 18 December 1985, which called for reporting on all expenditures by the United Nations for first-class travel, such expenditures are presented in three categories, in respect of (a) the travel of one member of each delegation attending sessions of the Assembly (least developed countries only); (b) the travel of one member of each delegation attending meetings of the Assembly at Geneva (least developed countries only); and (c) exceptions authorized by the Secretary-General.

3. Table 1 below sets out the expenditures arising from payment of travel expenses in respect of representatives of Member States within the limits authorized by the General Assembly in its resolution 1798 (XV+I) of 11 December 1962, as amended by recolutions 2245 (XXI) of 20 December 1966, 2489 (XXIII) of 21 December 1968 and 42/214.

4. In respect of all exceptions made to the rules on standards of accommodation for air travel applicable to the specific period, the report provides detailed information on resultant additional costs of, and reason for, such exceptions. The report demonstrates for the first time over the entire reporting period the effect on limiting first-class travel under the provisions adopted by the General Assembly at its forty-second session.

5. During the period 1 July 1988 to 30 June 1989, the Secretary-General exercised his discretion in authorizing first-class travel as an exception in accordance with paragraph 3 of General Assembly resolution 42/214 in 58 cases.

6. The details of the above-mentioned exceptions, presented in chronological order within category, are set out in tables 2 to 6 below. 1/
