THE POLICIES OF APARTHEID OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE
REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA

Report of the Secretary-General

Addendum

1. Since 30 September 1965, the Secretary-General has been informed of three additional contributions in response to the appeal of 26 October 1964 by the Special Committee on the Policies of Apartheid of the Government of the Republic of South Africa, addressed to Member States through the Secretary-General, for contributions to existing organizations for relief and assistance to the families of all persons persecuted by the South African Government for their opposition to the policies of apartheid.
2. By letter dated 6 October 1965, the Permanent Representative of Nigeria informed the Secretary-General that his Government had decided to make a contribution of \$1,400 and that it would be made through the Defence and Aid Fund International in London.^{1/}
3. By letter dated 27 October 1965, the Permanent Representative of Malaysia informed the Secretary-General that his Government had decided to make a contribution of \$5,000 which would be placed at the disposal of the appropriate organizations.^{2/}
4. By letter dated 30 October 1965, the Permanent Representative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics informed the Secretary-General that his Government had decided to contribute \$10,000 to the Defence and Aid Fund for assistance to the victims of apartheid in the Republic of South Africa.^{3/}
