NOTIFICATION NO. 2516-E/XIII-631-78 Dated Lucknow, 30 March 1978

In Exercise of the powers under sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 37A of the U.P. Excise Act, 1910 (U.P. Act No. IV. of 1910), the Governor is pleased to prohibit with effect from 1 April 1978, the import, transport and possession in, and export from the districts of Kanpur, Unnao, Lucknow, Barabanki, Dehra Dun, Nainital and Almora of liquor and intoxicating drugs in any quantity whatsoever, subject to the exception and conditions specified below:

1. The prohibition shall not apply to the import, export, transport and possession: ... $\frac{1}{2}$

(b) of lawfully manufactured or obtained liquor and intoxicating drugs up to the maximum quantities mentioned below by a <u>bona fide</u> traveller while passing through a prohibition area by air or rail:

(c) of consignment of lawfully manufactured or obtained liquor by rail or by road and of lawfully manufactured or obtained intoxicating drugs by rail from and to outside the prohibition areas, provided the consignments are not tampered with or used during transit;

(d) of lawfully manufactured or obtained liquor or intoxicating drugs for the manufacture of medicinal preparations or by or on behalf of the persons or institutions mentioned in appendixes C and D of the U.P. Excise Manual, Volume II, provided that such import, export, transport or possession does not contravene provisions of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (Act No. II of 1930), the Medicinal and Toilet Preparations (Excise Duties) Act, 1955 or any other act for the time being in force:

(e) of lawfully manufactured or obtained denatured spirit not exceeding 1.5 litres;

(f) of wine from grapes for sacramental purposes by priests or ministers of the Christian religion;

(g) of lawfully manufactured or obtained liquor (including denatured spirit exceeding 1.5 litres) or intoxicating drugs for <u>bona fide</u> industrial, scientific, educational or medical purposes, obtained under permits granted by the Collector in accordance with rules made in this behalf;

3. Subject to the provisions of the Medicinal and Toilet Preparations (Excise Duties) Act, 1955, Spirituous Preparations (Inter State Trade and Commerce) Control Act, 1955 or the rules made under any of the aforesaid Acts, and Uttar Pradesh Transport and Possession of Notified Spirituous Preparations (Prevention of Misuse) Rules, 1978 and Uttar Pradesh Sale of Notified Spirituous Preparations (Prevention of Misuse) Rules, 1978, the prohibition shall not apply to the import, export, transport, possession and sale of medicinal and toilet preparations containing alcohol or Indian hemp.

4. The prohibition shall not apply to the drawing of Nira for sale under a licence granted by the Collector under the provisions of the U.P. Nira (or Sweet Toddy) Rules, 1951. NOTE: For the purpose of this notification the word 'Troops' shall not include Military personnel on leave.

BOMBAY PROHIBITION ACT, 1949. $\frac{1}{}$

Whereas certain draft rules further to amend the Gujarat Poppy Capsules Rules, 1963 ^{2/} were published as required by sub-section (3) of section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), at pages 334 to 336 of the Government of Gujarat Gazette, Part IV-B, dated the 22nd April, 1976 under the Government Notification, Education and Labour Department No. GH/SH/361/BPA-1272/20100/P, dated the 6th April, 1976 inviting objections and suggestions from all persons likely to be affected thereby, till the 31st May, 1976;

And whereas the objections and suggestions received from the public on the said draft have been considered by the Government;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949) the Government of Gujarat hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Gujarat Poppy Capsules Rules, 1963, namely:

1. These rules may be called the Gujarat Poppy Capsules (Amendment) Rules, 1978.

2. In the Gujarat Poppy Capsules Rules, 1963 (hereinafter referred to as "the said rules") the heading "Exemption" and rule 3 thereunder shall be deleted.

3. In sub-rule (1) of rule 4 of the said rules, the words and figures "in excess of 100 grams" shall be deleted.

4. In rule 5 of the said rules, for sub-rule (4), the following shall be substituted, namely:

"(4) A licence under sub-rule (3) shall be granted in respect of the quantity not exceeding 50 kilograms of poppy capsules to be stocked at a time for sale."

5. In rule 5-A of the said rules, for the words and figures "exceeding 100 kilograms" the words and figures "exceeding 25 kilograms" shall be substituted.

6. In sub-rule (1) of rule 7 of the said rules, the words and figures "In excess of 100 grams" shall be deleted.

7. In sub-rule (i) of rule 8 of the said rules, the words and figures "in excess of 100 grams" shall be deleted.

8. In sub-rule (1) of rule 10 of the said rules, for the words and figures "in excess of quantity mentioned in rule 3" shall be deleted.

9. In sub-rule (2) of rule 13 of the said rules, for the words "the quantities of poppy capsules sold to them and the purpose for which they are sold" the words "and the quantities of poppy capsules sold to them" shall be substituted.

10. In form poppy-2 appended to the said rules,

(ii) in sub-condition (3) of condition 1, for the words and figures "exceeding 100 kilograms" the words and figures "exceeding 25 kilograms" shall be substituted;

(b) in sub-condition (2) of condition 4, for the words "quantities of poppy capsules sold to them and the purpose for which they are sold" the words "and the quantities of poppy capsules sold to them" shall be substituted.

11. In form poppy-6 appended to the said rules,

(i) the column 14 with the heading "quantity sold to individuals not holding permits" shall be deleted;

(ii) the existing columns "15, 16, 17 and 18" shall be renumbered as columns "14, 15, 16 and 17" respectively; and

(iii) in the heading relating to column 14 as so renumbered, for the figures and word "7, 10, 13 and 14" the figures and word "7, 10, and 13" shall be substituted.

12. In form poppy-7 appended to the said rules,

(i) in the heading relating to column 3, the words "if any" shall be deleted;

(ii) the column 5 with the heading "purpose for which sold" shall be deleted; and

(iii) the existing columns "6, 7 and 8" shall be renumbered as columns "5, 6 and 7" respectively.

NOTIFICATION No. 8 - Dangerous Drugs

No: 1: In pursuance of clause (a) of rule 2 of the Central Opium Rules, 1934, the Central Government hereby defines the tracts in the State of Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh specified in the Schedule annexed hereto as the tracts within which poppy may be cultivated on account of the Central Government during the opium year commencing on the 1st day of October 1978 and ending with the 30th day of September 1979.
