SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH  
THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN  
THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/16880 of 7 January 1985, S/16880/Add.4 of 13 February 1985, S/16880/Add.18 of 20 May 1985, S/16880/Add.24 of 9 July 1985 and S/16880/Add.39 of 6 November 1985.

During the week ending 14 December 1985, at its 2632nd meeting, held on 9 December 1985, pursuant to resolution 570 (1985) of 12 September 1985, the Security Council proceeded to the election of a member of the International Court of Justice to fill the seat which had become vacant as a result of the resignation, on 23 August 1985, of Judge Platon Dimitrievich Morozov.

In the course of the voting, Mr. Nikolai Konstantinovich Tarasov (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) received the required majority of votes in the Security Council.

As Mr. Nikolai Konstantinovich Tarasov also received the required majority of votes in the General Assembly, he was declared elected a member of the International Court of Justice for a term of office expiring on 5 February 1988.

During that week ending 14 December 1985, the Security Council took action on the following items:

Letter dated 6 December 1985 from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of Nicaragua to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council

In a letter dated 6 December 1985 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/17671), the representative of Nicaragua urgently requested that a meeting

of the Security Council be convened for the purpose of considering the extremely serious situation created by the escalation of acts of aggression, the repeated threats and the new acts of provocation directed against Nicaragua by the current United States Administration.

The Security Council considered the item at its 2633rd, 2634th and 2636th meetings, held between 10 and 12 December 1985.

In the course of the meetings, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Costa Rica, Cuba, Honduras, the Islamic Republic of Iran, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mexico, Nicaragua, the Syrian Arab Republic, Viet Nam and Zimbabwe, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

At its 2635th meeting, held on 12 December 1985, the Security Council resumed its consideration of the item on the basis of the reports of the Secretary-General on the United Nations operation in Cyprus covering the period 1 June to 30 November 1985 (S/17657 and Add.2) and 12 June to 9 December 1985 (S/17657/Add.1) respectively. The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Austria, Cyprus, Greece and Turkey, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote. In accordance with the agreement reached in the course of the Security Council's consultations, the President, with the consent of the Council, extended an invitation under rule 39 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure to Mr. Ozer Koray.

The President called attention to a draft resolution (S/17680) which had been prepared in the course of the Council's consultations. The Security Council then proceeded to vote on the draft resolution and adopted it unanimously as resolution 578 (1985).

Resolution 578 (1985) reads as follows:

The Security Council,

Noting the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations operation in Cyprus of 30 November 1985 (S/17657 and Add.2) and of 9 December 1985 (S/17657/Add.1),

Noting also the recommendation by the Secretary-General that the Security Council extend the stationing of the United Nations Peace-keeping Force in Cyprus for a further period of six months,

Noting further that the Government of Cyprus has agreed that in view of the prevailing conditions in the island it is necessary to keep the Force in Cyprus beyond 15 December 1985,

Reaffirming the provisions of resolution 186 (1964) of 4 March 1964 and other relevant resolutions,

1. Extends once more the stationing in Cyprus of the United Nations Peace-keeping Force established under resolution 186 (1964) for a further period ending on 15 June 1986;
2. Requests the Secretary-General to continue his mission of good offices, to keep the Security Council informed of the progress made and to submit a report on the implementation of the present resolution by 31 May 1986;
3. Calls upon all the parties concerned to continue to co-operate with the Force on the basis of the present mandate.
