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**SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH  
THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN  
THEIR CONSIDERATION****Addendum**

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional ruler of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is **submitting** the following summary statement.

The list of **items** of which the Security Council **is seized** is contained in documents **S/21100** of 24 January 1990, **S/21100/Add.2** of 2 February 1990, **S/21100/Add.5** of 16 February 1990, **S/21100/Add.21** of 7 June 1990, **S/21100/Add.30** of 10 August 1990 and **S/21100/Add.37** of 26 October 1990.

During the week ending 1 December 1990, the Security Council took action on the following items:

**The situation between Iraq and Kuwait** (see **S/21100/Add.30**, **S/21100/Add.31**, **S/21100/Add.32**, **S/21100/Add.33**, **S/21100/Add.36**, **S/21100/Add.37**, **S/21100/Add.38**, **S/21100/Add.42** and **S/21100/Add.43**)

The Security Council continued **its** consideration of the item at **its 2959th**, **2960th**, **2962nd** and **2963rd** meetings, between 27 and 29 November 1990,

In **response** to the request dated 26 November 1990 from the Permanent Representative of Egypt to **the** United Nations, in his capacity as Chairman of the Islamic Group at the United Nations (**S/21968**), the Security Council extended an invitation under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure to **Mr. A. Engin Ansay**, at **its 2959th** meeting.

In the **course** of the meetings, the President, with the **consent** of the Security Council, invited the representatives of Bahrain, Bangladesh, Egypt, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Kuwait, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

At the 2959th meeting, the President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution submitted by Côte d'Ivoire, Ethiopia, Finland, Kuwait and Zaire, contained in document S/21966.

At the 2962nd meeting, on 26 November 1990, the President informed the Security Council that Canada, Romania and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland had joined as sponsors of the draft resolution contained in document S/21966.

The Security Council then proceeded to vote on the draft resolution (S/21966) and adopted it unanimously as resolution 677 (1990).

Resolution 677 (1990) reads as follows:

**The Security Council,**

**Recalling** its resolutions 660 (1990) of 2 August 1990, 662 (1990) of 9 August 1990 and 674 (1990) of 29 October 1990,

**Reiterating its concern** for the suffering caused to individuals in Kuwait as a result of the invasion and occupation of Kuwait by Iraq,

**Gravely concerned** at the ongoing attempt by Iraq to alter the demographic composition of the population of Kuwait and to destroy the civil records maintained by the legitimate Government of Kuwait,

**Acting** under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations,

1. **Condemns** the attempts by Iraq to alter the demographic composition of the population of Kuwait and to destroy the civil records maintained by the legitimate Government of Kuwait;

2. **Mandates** the Secretary-General to take custody of a copy of the population register of Kuwait, the authenticity of which has been certified by the legitimate Government of Kuwait and which covers the registration of the population up to 1 August 1990;

3. **Requests** the Secretary-General to establish, in co-operation with the legitimate Government of Kuwait, an Order of Rules and Regulations governing access to and use of the said copy of the population register.

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 2963rd meeting, on 29 November 1990, at which 13 members of the Council were represented by their Foreign Ministers.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution, submitted by Canada, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United States of America (S/21969). The President informed the Council that France and Romania had joined as sponsors of the draft resolution.

The Security Council then proceeded to vote on the draft resolution (S/21969), and adopted it by 12 votes in favour, to 2 against (Cuba and Yemen), with 1 abstention (China), as resolution 678 (1990).

Resolution 678 (1990) reads as follows:

**The Security Council,**

**Recalling, and reaffirming its** resolutions 660 (1990) of 2 August 1990, 661 (1990) of 6 August 1990, 662 (1990) of 9 August 1990, 664 (1990) of 18 August 1990, 665 (1990) of 25 August 1990, 666 (1990) of 13 September 1990, 667 (1990) of 16 September 1990, 669 (1990) of 24 September 1990, 670 (1990) of 25 September 1990, 674 (1990) of 29 October 1990 and 677 (1990) of 28 November 1990,

**Noting that,** despite all efforts by the United Nations, Iraq refuses to comply with its obligation to implement resolution 660 (1990) and the above-mentioned subsequent relevant resolutions, in flagrant contempt of the Security Council,

Mindful of its duties and responsibilities under the Charter of the United Nations for the maintenance and preservation of international peace and security,

**Determined** to secure full compliance with its decisions,

**Acting** under Chapter VII of the Charter,

1. **Demands** that Iraq comply fully with resolution 660 (1990) and all subsequent relevant resolutions, and decides, while maintaining all its decisions, to allow Iraq one final opportunity, as a pause of goodwill, to do so;

2. **Authorizes** Member States co-operating with the Government of Kuwait, unless Iraq on or before 15 January 1991 fully implements, as set forth in paragraph 1 above, the foregoing resolutions, to use all necessary means to uphold and implement resolution 660 (1990) and all subsequent relevant resolutions and to restore international peace and security in the area;

3. **Requests** all States to provide appropriate support for the actions undertaken in pursuance of paragraph 2 of the present resolutions

4. **Requests** the States concerned to keep the Security Council regularly informed on the progress of actions undertaken pursuant to paragraphs 2 and 3 of the present resolution;

5. **Decides** to remain seized of the matter,

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 2961st meeting, on 28 November 1990, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Iran-Iraq Military Observer Group covering the period 22 September 1990 to 20 November 1990 (S/21960).

The President, with the consent of the Security Council, invited the representatives of the Islamic Republic of Iran and Iraq, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/21970), which had been prepared in the course of the Council's consultations.

The Security Council then proceeded to vote on the draft resolution (S/21970) and adopted it unanimously as resolution 676 (1990).

Resolution 676 (1990) reads as follows:

**The Security Council,**

**Recalling** its resolutions 598 (1987) of 20 July 1987, 619 (1988) of 9 August 1988, 631 (1989) of 8 February 1989, 642 (1989) of 29 September 1989, 651 (1990) of 29 March 1990 and 671 (1990) of 27 September 1990,

**Having considered** the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Iran-Iraq Military Observer Group of 23 November 1990 <sup>1/</sup> and taking note of the observations expressed therein,

1. **Decides** to extend the mandate of the United Nations Iran-Iraq Military Observer Group for a further period of two months, that is, until 31 January 1991, as recommended by the Secretary-General;

2. **Requests** the Secretary-General to submit, during January 1991, a report on his further consultations with the parties about the future of the United Nations Iran-Iraq Military Observer Group, together with his recommendations on this matter,

At its 2964th meeting, on 30 November 1990, the Security Council resumed its consideration of the item, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF) covering the period 22 May 1990 to 23 November 1990 (S/21950 and Corr.1).

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/21972), which had been prepared in the course of the Security Council's consultations.

The Security Council then proceeded to vote on the draft resolution (S/21972) and adopted it unanimously as resolution 679 (1990).

Resolution 679 (1990) reads as follows!

**The Security Council,**

**Having considered** the report Of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force, 1/

**Decides:**

(a) To call upon the parties concerned to implement immediately Security Council resolution 338 (1973) of 22 October 1973;

(b) To renew the mandate of the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force for another period of six months, that is, until 31 May 1991;

(c) To request the Secretary-General to submit, at the end of this period, a report on the developments in the situation and the measures taken to implement Security Council resolution 338 (1973).

Following the voting, the President of the Security Council stated that, in connection with the resolution just adopted on the renewal of the mandate of UNDOF, he had been authorized to make the following complementary statement on behalf of the Council (S/21974)!

"As is known, the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force <sup>1</sup>/ states, in paragraph 23:

'Despite the present quiet in the Israel-Syria sector, the situation in the Middle East as a whole continues to be potentially dangerous and is likely to remain so, unless and until a comprehensive settlement covering all aspects of the Middle East problem can be reached.'

"That statement of the Secretary-General reflects the View of the Security Council. "
