NOTE VERBALE DATED 26 JULY 1991 FROM THE CHARGE D'AFFAIRES A.I.  
OF THE PERMANENT MISSION OF GREECE TO THE UNITED NATIONS  
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Chargé d'affaires a.i. of Greece to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and with reference to His Excellency's Note No. SCPC/F/91(4-1) of 3 July 1991 has the honour to inform him of the following:

The Greek Government immediately after the invasion of Kuwait by Iraqi troops adopted a series of measures enumerated in Doc. S/21613 of 23.8.90 and has also been implementing EEC regulations 2340/90 and 3155/90.

All exports of arms and of any kind of military equipment from Greece are under governmental control and subject to a licence issued on a case-by-case basis by the Ministries of Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade.

The competent authorities involved in the export of military equipment have been informed of and strictly comply with the pertinent Security Council resolutions, namely resolutions 661 (1990), 687 (1991) and with the Guidelines annexed to the Secretary-General's report (S/22660) approved by the Security Council in resolution 700 (1991).

Consequently Greece does not sell or supply any kind of military equipment to Iraq.
