OF BULGARIA TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE
SECRETARY-GENERAL**

The Permanent Representative of the Republic of Bulgaria to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and with reference to the Secretary-General's note SCPC/7/91 (4-1) of 3 July 1991 related to Security Council resolution 700 (1991), has the honour to transmit the following:

Bulgaria is abiding strictly by all resolutions of the Security Council of the United Nations related to the Persian Gulf crisis and is firmly adhering to the international economic sanctions against Iraq. The Bulgarian Government has already undertaken concrete steps in this respect. The Council of Ministers has issued two decrees (number 90 of 13 August 1991 and number 104 of 22 October 1990) on halting trade, financial operations and transportation links with Iraq mandatory for all Bulgarian organizations and companies. The implementation of the provisions contained therein is monitored by the competent State authorities.

Bulgaria had terminated the sale and supply of arms to Iraq even before 2 August 1990. In implementing the obligations for Member States under resolutions 687 (1991) and 700 (1991), the Government of the Republic of Bulgaria is currently preparing a decree that, after its adoption, would implement in the country's legislation the principles enunciated in paragraphs 24, 25 and 27 of Security Council resolution 687 (1991).

Bulgaria is convinced that the Security Council resolutions on the situation between Iraq and Kuwait will make a substantial contribution to strengthening security and stability in that part of the world, and is prepared to actively assist in their implementation.
