NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

1. At the 97th plenary meeting of its forty-first session, on 4 December 1986, the General Assembly adopted resolution 41/95, entitled "Adverse consequences for the enjoyment of human rights of political, military, economic and other forms of assistance given to the racist and colonialist régime of South Africa". 1/

2. In paragraph 5 of the resolution, the General Assembly:

"Requests the Security Council urgently to consider the imposition of comprehensive and mandatory sanctions under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations against the racist régime of South Africa, in Particular:

(a) The Prohibition of all technological assistance or collaboration in the manufacture of arms and military supplies in South Africa;

(b) The cessation of all collaboration with South Africa in the nuclear field;

(c) The prohibition of all loans to, and all investments in, South Africa and the cessation of any trade with South Africa;

(d) An embargo on the supply of petroleum, petroleum products and other strategic goods to South Africa;"
