## LAWS AND REGULATIONS

PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION OF 13 JULY 1931 FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS, AS AMENDED BY THE PROTOCOL OF 11 DECEMBER 1946

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL-- In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative texts.

### NOTIFICATION

Dangerous Drugs

No. 2. In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (II of 1930), the Central Government hereby directs that the following further amendments shall be made in the Central Opium Rules, 1934, the same having been previously published as required by sub-section 1) of section 36 of the said Act, namely:

In clause (b) of rule 2 of the said Rules---

- a) the word "and" after the words "Hoshiarpur district" shall be omitted.
- b) after the words "Kohistan district", the words "and in the state of Uttar Pradesh, within the pargana of Jaunsar Bawar in the district of Dehradun and within the parganas of Jaunpur and Rawain in the district of Tehri Garhwal" shall be inserted.

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NOTIFICATION

Dangerous Drugs

No. 3. In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 6 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (II of 1930), the Central Government hereby directs that the following further amendments shall be made in the Central Manufactured Drugs Rules, 1934, the same having been previously published as required by sub-section (i) of section 36 of the said Act, namely:

In the said Rules:

1. For rule 6 and the "Table of Fees" appended thereto, the following rules shall be substituted, namely:

"6. The manufacture of medicinal hemp is prohibited save under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the annexed form granted by the Chief Excise Authority of the State in which the manufacture is to be carried on. An annual fee of Rs. 10/- shall be payable in advance to the State Government for each licence issued under this rule."

2. In the "Form of licence" -

- a) for the word "Collector", wherever it occurs, the words "Chief Excise Authority" shall be substituted;
- b) in condition no. (8) for the words "Collector's seal" the words "seal of the Chief Excise Authority" shall be substituted;
- c) in condition no. (10) the words "by the Collector or" shall be omitted;
- d) for the words "Collector of..." appearing at the end of the licence, the words "Chief Excise Authority...State" may be substituted.

Dangerous Drugs

No. 6. In pursuance of sub-clause (ii) of clause (g) of section 2 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (II of 1930), and article 11 of the International Convention for limiting the manufacture and regulating the distribution of narcotic drugs, signed at Geneva on the 13th July 1931, and article 1 of the Protocol signed at Paris on the 19th November 1948, bringing under international control drugs outside the scope of the Convention of 13th July 1931, which Convention and Protocol supplement the International Opium Convention, signed at Geneva on the 19th November 1925, the Central Government hereby declares the narcotic substances specified in this notification to be manufactured drugs and directs that the following further amendment shall be made in the notification of the Government of India in the late Finance Department (Central Revenues) No. 2 - Dangerous Drugs, dated the 10th January 1931, namely:

In the said notification after item 11, the following item shall be added, namely:

- "12. alpha-6-dimethylamino-4,4-diphenyl-3-acetoxyheptane (Alphacetylmethadol)<sup>1)</sup> and its salts,  
alpha-6-dimethylamino-4,4-diphenyl-3-heptanol (Alphamethadol) and its salts,  
beta-6-dimethylamino-4,4-diphenyl-3-acetoxyheptane (Betacetylmethadol) and its salts,  
3-dimethylamino-1,1-di-(2'-thienyl)-1-butene [Dimethylthiambutene]<sup>1)</sup> and its salts,  
3-ethylmethylamino-1,1-di-(2'-thienyl)-1-butene [Ethylmethylthiambutene] and its salts,  
6-methyl  $\Delta^6$ -desoxymorphine [Methyldesorphine] and its salts."
