In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

The Dangerous Drugs Law, 1942  
(Law 22 of 1942)

The Dangerous Drugs (Application) Order, 1952

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Governor in Executive Council by sub-section (3) of section 10 of the Dangerous Drugs Law, 1942, the following Order is hereby made:

1. This Order may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Application) Order, 1952.
2. It is hereby declared that Part IV of the Dangerous Drugs Law, 1942, shall apply to the following drugs -

Dihydrocodeine, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of dihydrocodeine.

Acetyldihydrocodeine, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substances containing any proportion of acetyldihydrocodeine.

4-Propionoxy-4-phenyl-1-methyl-3-ethylpiperidine, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of 4-propionoxy-4-phenyl-1-methyl-3-ethylpiperidine.

3-Hydroxy-N-methylmorphinan (commonly known as Methorphinan), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of 3-hydroxy-N-methylmorphinan.
