Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to forward to the Members of the United Nations and to the other parties to the Convention the following law communicated by the Government of the United Kingdom.

GAZETTE NOTIFICATION NO.180 OF 1946
The Poisons and Deleterious Drugs Ordinance,
1928, of North Borneo

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Supreme Allied Commander, South East Asia, and all other powers him enabling, the Officer Commanding the Military Forces in British Borneo and Chief Civil Affairs Officer, has directed that Schedule A of the Poisons and Deleterious Drugs Ordinance, 1928, of North Borneo, be amended by the addition thereto of the following;

Addition to Schedule A - Poisons

Benzedrine or any of its derivatives.

Synthetic preparations, structually allied to Chinchona (Quinine) including atebrine, mepacrine, pamaquin, plasmoquin and any preparation, admixture, or extract thereof.

Penicillin or any of its salts, ointments, tablets or other preparations containing penicillin.

Sulphonamides and any member of the "Sulpha" group including;

Sulphadiazine

Sulphaguanidine

Sulphanilamide

Sulphamerizine

Sulphapyridine (Syn. M & B 693 and Dagenan)

Sulphathiazole

or any proprietary preparation thereof, and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substances mentioned.

All vaccines, anti-toxins, toxoids or sera.

All vitamin preparations for injection.
