UNITED NATIONS INSTITUTE FOR TRAINING AND RESEARCH

Report of the Second Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Leandro I. VERCELES (Philippines)

1. The General Assembly, at its 1843rd plenary meeting, on 18 September 1970, allocated to the Second Committee agenda item 39, entitled "United Nations Institute for Training and Research: report of the Executive Director".
2. The Second Committee considered this item at its 1336th and 1337th meetings, on 9 November 1970. At the 1336th meeting, the Committee heard an introductory statement by Chief S.O. Adebo, Executive Director of the Institute.
3. When considering the item, the Committee had before it the report of the Executive Director.^{1/}
4. At the 1336th meeting, the representative of Denmark, on behalf of the delegations of Canada, Ceylon, Chile, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, Ghana, Hungary, India, Iran, Jamaica, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Nigeria, Turkey and Venezuela, introduced a draft resolution (A/C.2/L.1123).
5. El Salvador, the Dominican Republic, Pakistan, Singapore, Southern Yemen, and the United States of America joined in sponsoring the draft resolution.
6. At the 1337th meeting, the Committee adopted the draft resolution without objection (see paragraph 7 below).

RECOMMENDATION OF THE SECOND COMMITTEE

7. The Second Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

United Nations Institute for Training and Research

The General Assembly,

Recalling its past resolutions relating to the United Nations Institute for Training and Research, particularly resolution 2509 (XXIV) of 21 November 1969, and the resolutions of the Economic and Social Council on the same subject,

1. Takes note of the report of the Executive Director of the United Nations Institute for Training and Research;^{2/}

2. Notes with satisfaction the increasing effectiveness of the Institute in the discharge of its responsibilities;

3. Expresses the hope that the Institute will have greater and wider financial support.
