For the resolutions adopted by the General Conference between 2 and 9 September 1969, please refer to General Conference document OPANAL/S/1.

The Arabic and Roman numerals identifying each resolution indicate, respectively, the number of the resolution and the session at which it was adopted. Resolutions are numbered in the order of their adoption.

The document also contains the agenda of the first session, a list of the officers of the General Conference and of the two Main Committees, and separate lists of delegations, observers and resolutions adopted.

CHAPTER I

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED WITHOUT REFERENCE TO A MAIN COMMITTEE

RESOLUTION 25 (I)

STATUS OF ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL II OF THE TREATY OF TLATELOLCO

The General Conference,

Mindful of resolution 1 (I) of 5 September 1969,

1. Notes with satisfaction that the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland deposited on 11 December 1969 its instrument of ratification of Additional Protocol II of the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America (Treaty of Tlatelolco);

2. Notes also that the President of the United States of America has transmitted the Protocol to the Senate with the recommendation that it should give it prompt and favourable consideration;

3. Notes that the item "Status of the implementation of resolution 2456 B (XXIII) concerning the signature and ratification of Additional Protocol II of the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America (Treaty of Tlatelolco)" has been included in the agenda of the twenty-fifth session of the General Assembly of the United Nations, as at 10 July 1970;

4. Calls upon the States members of the Agency for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America to instruct their representatives who will be attending the aforesaid session to make every effort to ensure that the General Assembly adopts such decisions as may be considered most effective for inducing non-nuclear-weapon States which have not yet done so to sign and ratify the aforementioned Additional Protocol II as soon as possible.

RESOLUTION 26 (I)

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE TREATY OF TLATELOLCO

The General Conference,

Mindful of resolution 12 (I) of 8 September 1969,

1. Notes with satisfaction that the Governments of Guatemala and Venezuela have become members of the Agency for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in

Latin America on depositing their instruments of ratification of the Treaty of Tlatelolco on 6 February and 23 March 1970, respectively, exercising the right referred to in article 28, paragraph 2, of the Treaty;

2. Calls again upon the States lying within the area covered by the Treaty, which have signed it, to strive to do everything within their power to ensure the speedy and fullest implementation of the Treaty.

RESOLUTION 27 (I)

ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL I OF THE TREATY OF TLATELOLCO

The General Conference,

Mindful of resolution 13 (I) of 8 September 1969,

1. Notes with satisfaction that the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland deposited on 11 December 1969 its instrument of ratification of Additional Protocol I of the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America (Treaty of Tlatelolco);

2. Calls once more upon States which, de jure or de facto, are internationally responsible for territories which lie within the limits of the geographical zone established by the Treaty to make every effort to take the necessary steps to become parties to Additional Protocol I, in order that the populations of those territories may enjoy the benefits deriving from the Treaty.

Having considered the report of the Acting General Secretary reproduced in document OPANAL/23,

1. Takes note of, and expresses its appreciation to the Acting General Secretary for, the report submitted by him;
2. Expresses its appreciation to the Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency for the information which he has supplied on the work done by the Agency and on the preparation of a model draft safeguards agreement;
3. Invites the Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency to proceed with the preparation of a model draft safeguards agreement which could serve as a basis for the negotiations referred to in article 13 of the Treaty of Tlatelolco and to inform the Acting General Secretary of the Agency for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America (OPANAL) of the progress made;

RESOLUTION 22 (I)

USE OF NUCLEAR ENERGY FOR PEACEFUL PURPOSES

The General Conference,

Mindful of resolution 2 (I) of 5 September 1969,

Having considered the report of the Acting General Secretary on the use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes,^{1/}

Having examined the comments of Governments on this matter,^{2/}

Reaffirming the advantage to States Parties to the Treaty of Tlatelolco to use nuclear energy for peaceful purposes, in particular for their economic and social progress,

Considering that, in using nuclear energy for peaceful purposes, the Latin American States should avoid wastage of resources and duplication of efforts,

Noting with interest that the Acting General Secretary has held a preliminary exchange of view with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA),

1. Notes with appreciation the report of the Acting General Secretary on the use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes;

2. Authorizes the Acting General Secretary to continue the exchange of views with UNDP and IAEA in order to explore the possibility of establishing co-operation agreements between those institutions and OPANAL, with a view to avoiding duplication of effort;

3. Trusts that the Administrator of UNDP and the Director-General of IAEA will co-operate with the Acting General Secretary in carrying out the tasks entrusted to him;

4. Requests the Acting General Secretary to transmit the text of this resolution to the Administrator of UNDP and the Director-General of IAEA.

RESOLUTION 23 (I)

USE OF NUCLEAR ENERGY FOR PEACEFUL PURPOSES

The General Conference,

Recalling that article 17 of the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America (Treaty of Tlatelolco) provides that nothing in the provisions of the Treaty "shall prejudice the rights of the Contracting Parties in conformity with this Treaty, to use nuclear energy for peaceful purposes, in particular for their economic and social progress",

Noting that the sixteenth preambular paragraph of the Treaty refers to the necessity that nuclear energy should be used in Latin America exclusively for peaceful purposes, and "that the Latin American countries should use their right to the greatest and most equitable possible access to this new source of energy in order to expedite the economic and social progress of their peoples",

/...

Bearing in mind the comments of member States and the desirability of maintaining the regular budget of the Agency for the present within the limits necessary for administrative expenditures,

Decides:

1. To establish a Special Fund, financed by voluntary annual contributions, for promoting the use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes among the States members of the Agency;
2. To hold the First Pledging Conference for the Fund on Tuesday, 19 January 1971;
3. To invite the States Parties to the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America or to either of its two Additional Protocols to participate in the Conference referred to in operative paragraph 2;
4. To urge the States indicated in the preceding paragraph to contribute, so far as they are able, to the attainment of the objectives established in this connexion by the General Conference;
5. To request the Acting General Secretary to transmit the text of this resolution to the States referred to in operative paragraph 3 and to convene the Pledging Conference in good time.

(Adopted at the 7th meeting on 10 September 1970)

RESOLUTION 24 (I)

USE OF NUCLEAR ENERGY FOR PEACEFUL PURPOSES

The General Conference,

Having considered the report of the Acting General Secretary and the comments of member States on the use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes,^{1/}

Considering the financing opportunities offered by the Special Fund of OPANAL established by resolution 23 (I),

Noting the possibility of concluding co-operation agreements between OPANAL and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA),

Recognizing the advantages accruing to member States from the promotion of activities aimed at the peaceful development of nuclear energy,

Decides:

1. To authorize the Acting General Secretary, to the extent rendered possible by the voluntary contributions to the Special Fund of OPANAL, to organize international meetings, preferably on the exploration for and processing of radioactive minerals or the applications of nuclear technology to medicine;
2. To invite the States Parties to the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America or to either of its two Additional Protocols, and the Administrator of UNDP and the Director-General of IAEA, to facilitate, so far as they are able, the holding of the meetings referred to in the preceding paragraph;
3. To urge the States and the international organizations referred to in the preceding paragraph, with a view to encouraging progress in the use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes, to offer the best possible facilities to nationals of States members of OPANAL for instruction in basic techniques, training in nuclear centres or any other related activity;
4. To request the Acting General Secretary to transmit the text of this resolution to the States and international organizations referred to in operative paragraph 2.

The General Conference elected Mr. Rafael Arízaga Vega (Ecuador) Vice-President in the absence of Mr. Miguel Roca Osorio (Ecuador).

The agenda adopted at the first part of the first session (OPANAL/S/1) was used for the work of the second part, but the General Conference did not take up those items which it felt had been adequately dealt with during the first part.

The General Conference decided that the First and Second Committees, established at the first session, would continue to deal with political and legal questions and technical, administrative and budgetary questions, respectively.

(6th meeting, 7 September 1970)

Allocation of items to the plenary Conference and the Main Committees

The items "Annual Report of the Acting General Secretary" (OPANAL/24), "Election of the General Secretary" and matters related to the implementation of the Treaty and the Additional Protocols were allocated to the plenary Conference.

The items "Cable dated 23 April 1968 from the Minister of State of Guyana" and "Implementation of article 13 of the Treaty of Tlatelolco" (OPANAL/23) were allocated to the Committee on Political and Legal Questions.

The items "Budget estimates of the Agency for 1971" (OPANAL/21), "Accounts of the Agency" (OPANAL/26), "Supplementary budget estimates" (OPANAL/27) and "Use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes: measures which should be adopted in implementation of the sixteenth preambular paragraph and article 17 of the Treaty of Tlatelolco" (OPANAL/22 and annexes, OPANAL/25) were allocated to the Committee on Technical, Administrative and Budgetary Questions.

(6th meeting, 7 September 1970)

Documents and records of the Conference

It was decided that the General Conference should have verbatim records of its plenary meetings and that the Committees should have a report, as comprehensive and detailed as required, containing the draft resolutions which each Committee wished to submit to the plenary Conference.

(6th meeting, 7 September 1970)

Times of meetings

The times of meetings were established as follows: as a general rule, morning meetings from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and afternoon meetings from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m.

(6th meeting, 7 September 1970)

Closing date

Friday, 11 September 1970, was set as the closing date of the second part of the first session of the General Conference.

(6th meeting, 7 September 1970)

Convening of the Council

9 September 1970 was set as the date for convening the Council of the Agency.

(6th meeting, 7 September 1970)

Election of the Chairmen of the Main Committees

As the Main Committees of the General Conference were without presiding officers, it was decided to reconvene them so that they could elect their respective Chairmen.

(6th meeting, 7 September 1970)

Term of office of the Acting General Secretary

It was agreed that the Acting General Secretary should remain in office until the General Secretary took office.

(8th meeting, 11 September 1970)

Duties of the General Secretary

It was agreed that the duties and functions vested in the Acting General Secretary would be deemed to be vested in the General Secretary as from the date he took office.

(8th meeting, 11 September 1970)

Investment of funds

The Acting General Secretary was authorized to proceed in accordance with his suggestion in paragraphs 61 to 63 of his annual report (OPANAL/24).

(8th meeting, 11 September 1970)

External Auditor

It was agreed to request member States to transmit to the secretariat of OPANAL the names of persons considered qualified to perform the duties of External Auditor, and that the secretariat should distribute the list of those names to all member States two months before the opening of the next session so that the General Conference could elect an External Auditor at its next session.

Working languages

The secretariat was requested to prepare an estimate of the annual budgetary increase which would be involved, firstly, by the reproduction and distribution of all OPANAL documents in English, French and Portuguese and, secondly, by the reproduction and distribution of only the main documents in those languages, with a definition of what was meant by "main documents". The secretariat was asked to submit separate estimates for French and English, on one hand, and for Portuguese, on the other.
