Poland: draft resolution

The General Assembly,

Recommends:

1. That Eritrea should be granted independence after three years.
2. That during that period Eritrea should be governed by a Council of six members, namely: one representative of Ethiopia, two representatives of the Arab countries and three representatives of the population of Eritrea, the latter comprising two from the indigenous population and one from the European population. The Council shall report annually to the General Assembly of the United Nations; it shall appoint an Administrator with executive authority and responsible to itself.
3. That the British occupation forces should be withdrawn from Eritrea within a time limit of three months reckoned from the adoption of this resolution by the General Assembly.
4. That Ethiopia should be ceded that part of the territory of Eritrea which is necessary to secure Ethiopia's access to the sea through the port of Assab.
