OF THE DELEGATION OF THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST

New York, 5 December 1950

Mr. President,

The delegation of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics to the fifth session of the General Assembly has received the following telegram from Mrs. Vaillant-Couturier, Secretary-General of the Women's International Democratic Federation:

"Mr. Andrei Vyshinsky  
Chairman of the USSR Delegation  
United Nations, Lake Success

In the name of 91 million women of 59 countries we indignantly protest against President Truman's monstrous proposal to consider using the atomic bomb in Korea. We request the Security Council to condemn such a statement by the representative of a State Member of the Security Council as contrary to the very principles of the United Nations."
