Letter dated 10 December 1956 from the Permanent Representative
of Romania to the United Nations, addressed to the
Secretary-General

New York, 10 December 1956

With reference to your letter of 5 December 1956 I have the honour to
communicate the following:

"The Government of the Romanian People's Republic considers that
the sending of United Nations observers to the countries adjoining
Hungary is not in accordance with the provisions of the United Nations
Charter.

"Being interested in the return to normal life in Hungary,
a neighbouring and friendly country, and taking the view that this is in
the interest of peace and security in Europe and in accordance with the
sovereign rights of States, the Romanian Government is unable to admit
United Nations observers to the territory of the Romanian People's Republic."
