APPOINTMENTS TO FILL VACANCIES IN THE MEMBERSHIP
OF SUBSIDIARY BODIES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

UNITED NATIONS ADMINISTRATIVE TRIBUNAL

Note by the Secretary-General

1. Article 3, paragraphs 1 and 2, of the Statute of the United Nations Administrative Tribunal (General Assembly resolution 351 A (IV)) provides that:

"1. The Tribunal shall be composed of seven members, no two of whom may be nationals of the same State. Only three shall sit in any particular case.

"2. The members shall be appointed by the General Assembly for three years, and they may be re-appointed; provided, however, that of the members initially appointed, the terms of two members shall expire at the end of one year and the terms of two members shall expire at the end of two years. A member appointed to replace a member whose term of office has not expired shall hold office for the remainder of his predecessor's term."

2. The present composition of the Tribunal is as follows:

Mrs. Paul Bastid (France);

The Right Honourable Lord Crook (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland);

Mr. Francisco Forteza (Uruguay);

Mr. Vincent Mutuale (Democratic Republic of the Congo);

Mr. Francis T.P. Plimpton (United States of America);

Mr. Zenon Rossides (Cyprus);

Mr. R. Venkataraman (India).

3. At its twenty-second session, the General Assembly, by resolution 2268 (XXII) of 16 November 1967, appointed Mrs. Bastid, Mr. Ignacio-Pinto and Mr. Venkataraman for three-year terms beginning on 1 January 1968. At its twenty-fourth session, the General Assembly, by resolution 2495 B (XXIV) of 5 December 1969 appointed Mr. Vincent Mutuale for a one-year term beginning on 1 January 1970, to complete the unexpired term of Mr. Ignacio-Pinto, who had resigned effective 31 December 1969. Since the terms of office of these members of the Tribunal expire on 31 December 1970, it will be necessary for the General Assembly at its twenty-fifth session to appoint three persons to fill the resulting vacancies. The persons so appointed will serve for a period of three years, beginning on 1 January 1971.
4. At previous sessions, the Fifth Committee, after a secret ballot, submitted to the General Assembly a draft resolution containing the names of the persons recommended for appointment. It is suggested that a similar procedure be followed at the twenty-fifth session.
