BUDGET ESTIMATES FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1952

Supplementary estimates for section 3 in respect of the third
session of the Group of Experts on Road Signs and SignalsTenth report of 1952 of the Advisory Committee on
Administrative and Budgetary Questions

1. The Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions has considered a report by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/486) submitting estimates in respect of the third (1952) session (to be held at Headquarters) of the Group of Experts on Road Signs and Signals, which was set up under the terms of Economic and Social Council resolution 272 (X) of 8 February 1950.
2. Provision for a 1952 session of the Group of Experts was omitted from the original 1952 estimates in the expectation, which has not in fact been fulfilled, that the work of the Group would have been completed during 1951. The present estimates cover the travel and subsistence expenses of the expert members of the Group to the amount appropriated in 1951 for the second session (\$9,970). Actual expenditure for the 1950 session at Headquarters amounted to \$9,500; the corresponding figure for the 1951 session at Geneva is expected to be in the neighbourhood of \$8,500.
3. On this basis, the Advisory Committee recommends for approval the provision of \$9,970 under section 3, chapter XVI, of the 1952 budget, together with a corresponding reduction in the appropriation provisionally approved for section 33 (Investigations, Inquiries and other activities).
