Germany addressed to the Secretary-General

With regard to the great danger which the mining of the entire territory of northern Somalia constitutes for the civilian population, the German non-governmental organization "Komitee ap Anamur" has asked the German Government to support a mine-clearing programme which is already being implemented by "Komitee Kap Anamur". In particular, the Committee has asked for the provision of two demilitarized mine-clearing tanks. The "Komitee Kap Anamur" has committed itself to using qualified experts for the handling of the material.

The German Government is ready to grant the request for the provision of the mine-clearing tanks. The German Government assumes that this humanitarian measure does not conflict with the provisions of Security Council resolution 733 (1992).
