ALICE WEIL APPOINTED ASSISTANT SECRETARY-GENERAL FOR GENERAL SERVICES

Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar announced today the appointment of Alice Weil as Assistant Secretary-General for General Services, with effect from 7 July 1934.

Mrs. Weil, a national of the United States, will replace Clayton C. Timbrell, who has submitted his resignation with effect from 5 July 1984 in order to retire after 3d years of service with the Organization.

Since 1980, Ars. Weil has been Director of the General Legal Division in the Office of Legal Affairs. She joined the United Mations in 1952 and has served in the Division of Human Aights and in the Office of Legal Affairs.
