Mr. Daniels: Proposed resolution on salaries  
for members of the Sub-Commission

(Item 12 of the agenda)

The Sub-Commission on the Prevention of Discrimination and the Protection  
of Minorities.

Considering that the per diem, without salary, provided for the members of the Sub-commission on the Prevention of Discrimination and the Protection of Minorities is inadequate to meet the expenses which they necessarily incur in attending its sessions.

Recommends that the Commission on Human Rights request the Economic and Social Council to propose to the General Assembly (1) that members of the Sub-commission on the Prevention of Discrimination and the Protection of Minorities be paid a salary in addition to the per diem which they now receive, and (2) that such a salary be equal to that received by experts appointed to the Secretariat, inasmuch as the members of the Sub-commission are appointed as experts in their individual capacities, and

Recommends that the Secretary-General prepare for the use of the Commission on Human Rights, in connexion with this resolution, an analysis of the per diems and salaries provided for the various categories of experts in the United Nations.
