APPLICATION OF THE REPUBLIC OF UZBEKISTAN FOR ADMISSION TO MEMBERSHIP IN THE UNITED NATIONS (S/23451)

The CHAIRMAN said that, at the 3037th meeting of the Security Council, held on 23 January 1992, the President of the Council had decided to refer to the Committee the application of the Republic of Uzbekistan for admission to membership in the United Nations, contained in the letter dated 6 January 1992 from the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan addressed to the Secretary-General (S/23451), for examination and report to the Council.

The Secretariat had prepared a draft report, which had been distributed to the Committee members. Inasmuch as the Republic of Uzbekistan had submitted its application during the recessed forty-sixth session of the General Assembly, the Committee recommended, in its draft report, that the Council should have recourse to the provision of the last paragraph of rule 60 of its provisional rules of procedure.

If he heard no objection, he would take it that the Committee wished to adopt its report to the Security Council.
