1. Note verbale from the Permanent Mission of Chile to the United Nations addressed to the Secretariat

The Permanent Mission of Chile to the United Nations ... wishes to refer to the report contained in the note verbale of 17 September 1987 (see A/42/485/Add.2).

The report states that the person who daubed paint on the door of the Embassy of Chile in the United Kingdom and unfurled a banner bearing political slogans against the Government of Chile was taken into custody and questioned by the police, and it was added that the final outcome was unknown.

Further to this information, the Permanent Mission of Chile wishes to state that the Embassy of Chile in the United Kingdom was not a party in the proceedings against the British national Peter George Duncan Searles and that that British Government destroyed the costs incurred by the Embassy of Chile in making good the damage.

The Permanent Mission of the Federal Republic of Germany to the United Nations ... has the honour to communicate the following:

During the night of 19/20 June 1987, an unknown perpetrator committed an arson attempt against the chancery of the Peruvian Embassy in Bonn. A Molotov cocktail started a fire in the basement of the building. The fire brigade arrived promptly at the scene and extinguished the fire, which caused minor property damage.
