4. **ACTIVITIES OF INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS  
CONCERNED WITH REGULATIONS OR  
RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE TRANSPORT OF  
DANGEROUS GOODS AT AN INTERNATIONAL LEVEL**

Many international organizations have participated in the work of the Sub-Committee of Experts on the Transport of Dangerous Goods and have contributed to the development of the Recommendations and to the harmonization of these with other international regulations.

**International Maritime Organization**

Report of IMO activities with respect to the marine transport of hazardous waste in packaged form (IMO).

It is expected that the Committee will be informed of the outcome of the 44th session of IMO Sub-Committee on the Carriage of Dangerous Goods (19-23 October 1992) and of the progress made with regard to the implementation of the UN Recommendations on the Transport of Dangerous Goods through the International Maritime Dangerous Goods Code.

**International Civil Aviation Organization**

ICAO has already published the 1993/1994 version of the Technical Instructions for the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air, which takes into account the seventh revision of the UN Recommendations. A meeting of the Dangerous Goods Panel Working Group of the Whole will be held in Edinburgh from 12 to 16 October 1992.

**Central office for International Railway Transport  
and Economic Commission for Europe**

A new version of RID and of ADR will enter into force on 1 January 1993; Classes 1, 4.1, 4.2, 4.3, 5.1, 5.2 and 9 have been harmonized on the basis of the UN Recommendations. The RID/ADR Joint Meeting is now working on the harmonization of Classes 3, 6.1, 8 and 6.2 and a new major amendment is expected for 1 January 1995.

**ILO/WHO/UNEP International Programme for Chemical Safety (IPCS)**

A Co-ordinating Group for the Harmonization of Chemical Classification Systems has been established by IPCS and this Group includes as its core the organizations at present cooperating with the IPCS - namely ILO, WHO and UNEP - as well as OECD and this Committee.

Following adoption by the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development of "Agenda 21" which includes a Chapter 19 on the Environmentally Sound Management of Toxic Chemicals including Prevention of Illegal International Traffic in Toxic and Dangerous Products (and a proposed programme area on harmonization of classification and labelling of chemicals), work has been initiated by the Coordinating Group and a report on its second meeting (16 and 17 November 1992) will be presented to the Committee.

In this context, OECD has also initiated a "Clearing House" on Classification of Chemicals to examine existing systems based upon toxicity and environmental hazard. The Committee will be made aware of the latest developments.

### **United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP)**

The Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal entered into force on 5 May 1992 and there were twenty-nine Contracting Parties as of 18 August 1992. Technical Guidelines for the Environmentally Sound Management of Wastes subject to the Basel Convention are under preparation, for consideration at the first meeting of the Conference of the Parties to be convened in Montevideo (Uruguay) from 30 October to 4 December 1992.

UNEP has also developed the London Guidelines for the Exchange of Information on Chemicals in International Trade, amended 1989, with a view to increasing chemical safety through the exchange of information on chemicals, and is working on the development of a draft model national legislation on the management of chemicals for the implementation of the amended London Guidelines.

### **International Standardization Organization**

The draft International Standard (ISO/DIS 7225-2: Labels for gas cylinders) has been circulated for comments.

### **International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA)**

Following the ninth session of the IAEA Standing Advisory Group on the Safe Transport of Radioactive Material (SAGSTRAM) (Vienna, 5 to 9 October 1992) the Committee will be informed of the progress made in the process of the 1995 revision of the IAEA Transport Regulations (Regulations for the Safe Transport of Radioactive Material (Safety series No.6) and the supporting documents (Safety series 7, 37 and 80).
