II. ANNOTATIONS TO THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA

Item 1 Procedural matters

The rules of procedure of the Board are contained in TD/B/16/Rev.4 and Corr.1. The guidelines for the Trade and Development Board in executive session are annexed to the present document for ease of reference.

Item 1(a) Adoption of the agenda

The consultations of the Secretary-General of UNCTAD on 21 January 1993 approved the addition of an item relating to the restructuring of the economic and social sectors of the United Nations system in relation to UNCTAD. (cf. item 3).

Item 1(b) Designation of the President of the fortieth session of the Board

It will be recalled that, by decision 360 (XXXV), of 5 October 1988, the Board reaffirmed its decision 338 (XXXIII), of 9 September 1986, whereby it agreed that it would be desirable for the board to identify, before the end of each regular session, the person to be elected as President at its next regular session, so as to enable the person concerned to participate in an advisory capacity in the preparatory work for the regular session at which he would serve as President.

In accordance with the cycle for the rotation (contained in annex I to the rules of procedure of the Board), the President at the fortieth session shall be a representative of one of the Asian States in List A.

Item 2 Reports and activities of the subsidiary bodies of the Board: matters requiring action

In calling for the policy function of the Board to be strengthened, the Conference, in paragraph 67 of the Cartagena Commitment, called upon its executive sessions, inter alia, to react to reports from the subsidiary bodies, in order to give impetus to ongoing work.

In taking note of the outcome of sessions of various subsidiary bodies, the pre-session executive session may also wish to make appropriate recommendations.

The question of specific dates for future meetings will be taken up by the Board at the second part of its thirty-ninth session within the framework of agenda item 11 (c) - Review of Calendar of Meetings.

Item 2(a) Standing Committee on Commodities,
first session (19-23 October 1992)

The Standing Committee on Commodities, established pursuant to paragraph 70 of the Cartagena Commitment, held its first session from 19 to 23 October 1992.

The Committee adopted its work programme, which is contained in annex I to the report on the session (see agreed conclusions 1(1)). The Committee also decided, by decision 2(1), to establish, as its subsidiary organs, the Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Tungsten and the Intergovernmental Group on Experts on Iron Ore, as now constituted.

In accordance with its terms of reference, the Committee also initiated discussions on the proposed world conference on commodities, called for by the Conference at its eighth session.

The Board's attention is drawn to paragraph 80 to 81 of the report of the Committee, which state that the Committee should meet once annually; and that while the work programme should provide the content of its agendas, the choice of the specific agenda topics within the main headings of the work programme should be determined in the consultative mechanism of the Secretary-General of UNCTAD in accordance with paragraph 83 of the Cartagena Commitment, taking into account the evolution of the world commodity situation and progress in the work of the secretariat.

The Board may wish to take note of the report of the Standing Committee on Commodities on its first session and to endorse the work programme and decision 2(1) contained in annex I thereto.

In connection with this item, attention is drawn to General Assembly resolution 47/185, of 22 December 1992, entitled "Commodities".

Item 2(b) Standing Committee on Developing Services Sectors:
Fostering Competitive Services Sectors in Developing Countries,
first session (26-30 October 1992)

The Standing Committee on Developing Services Sectors: Fostering Competitive Services Sectors in Developing Countries, established pursuant to paragraph 70 of the Cartagena Commitment, held its first session from 26 to 30 October 1992.

The Committee adopted its work programme as contained in annex I to the report on the session.

The Board's attention is drawn to paragraphs 40 and 41 of the report, reflecting the Committee's agreement that the agenda for its next session should be referred to the consultative mechanism of the Secretary-General of UNCTAD, in accordance with paragraph 83 of the Cartagena Commitment, taking into account the elements from the work programme of the Committee, and its decision concerning the timing of its second session and that the exact date be referred to the Group on Calendar Matters.

Particular attention is drawn to paragraph 42 of the report, whereby the Standing Committee agreed that the issue of possibly convening an expert group or groups should be examined in the context of the deliberations of the executive session of the Board when it considers the report of the Standing Committee.

The Board may wish to take note of the report of the Standing Committee on its first session and to endorse the work programme in annex I. The Board may also wish to make any appropriate recommendations, particularly in regard to paragraph 42 of the report.

Item 2(c) Standing Committee on Developing Services Sectors:
Shipping, first session (2-6 November 1992)

The Standing Committee on Developing Services Sectors: Fostering Competitive Services Sectors in Developing Countries - Shipping, established pursuant to paragraphs 70 and 72 of the Cartagena Commitment, held its first session from 2 to 6 November 1992.

The Committee adopted its work programme in the fields of shipping, ports and multimodal transport as contained in annex I to the report on the session.

In discussing the elements for the provisional agenda for its second session, the Committee requested the secretariat to provide delegations with adequate information on the underlying rationale for a group of experts on ports, and on its proposed objectives and functions, prior to the submission of a proposal to the Trade and Development Board for approval.

The consultations of the Secretary-General of UNCTAD on 21 January 1993, having been informed of the follow-up action in response to the decision of the Committee, approved the draft provisional agenda for the second session - on shipping - of the Standing Committee (TD/B/CN.4/17) and also recommended that the Board at its executive session decide to convene the Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Ports.

The Committee also adopted a decision (cf. annex II to the report) whereby the UNCTAD secretariat was called upon to provide to the Trade and Development Board, through its President, before 31 January 1993, a list of specific outputs and activities, as well as the estimated dates of completion of work for each of the elements of the work programme. The note by the secretariat is circulated in document TD/B/EX(2)/3.

Attention is drawn to paragraph 45 of the report, reflecting the Committee's decision that its second session would be held early in 1994 and that the third session would meet late in 1995 (the exact dates to be determined by the Group on Calendar Matters).

The Board may wish to take note of the report of the Committee on its first session and to endorse the work programme (annex I). The Board may also wish to take note of the follow-up action called for in the decision of the Committee contained in annex II, in the light of the recommendations of the consultations held on 21 January 1993, and approve the convening of the Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Ports.

Item 2(d) Ad Hoc Working Group on Investment and Financial Flows,
first session (9 - 13 November 1992)

The Ad Hoc Working Group on Investment and Financial Flows, Non-debt-creating Finance for Development: New Mechanisms for Increasing Investment and Financial Flows, established pursuant to paragraph 70 of the Cartagena Commitment, held its first session from 9 to 13 November 1992.

The Ad Hoc Working Group adopted its work programme as contained in annex I to the Report on the session.

The Ad Hoc Working Group on Trade Efficiency, established pursuant to paragraph 70 of the Cartagena Commitment, held its first session from 16 to 20 November 1992.

The Working Group adopted its work programme as contained in annex II to the report on the session.

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Item 2(f) Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Restrictive Business Practices, eleventh session (23 - 27 November 1992)

The Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Restrictive Business Practices held its eleventh session from 23 to 27 November 1992.

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Item 2(g) Ad Hoc Working Group on Comparative Experiences with Privatization, first session (30 November - 4 December 1992)

The Ad Hoc Working Group on Comparative Experiences with Privatization, established pursuant to paragraph 79 of the Cartagena Commitment, held its first session from 30 November to 4 December 1992.

The Ad Hoc Working Group adopted its work programme at its first session as contained in annex I of the report of the session.

The Working Group agreed on the topics to be considered at each of its subsequent sessions, including particular topics for its in-depth consideration at its second and third session in 1993, and the basic elements for privatization at its fourth session in 1994. It also approved the provisional agenda for its second session (cf. annex II of the report).

The Working Group requested the secretariat to compile a list of the main publications and national legal materials relevant to the work of the Working Group, and to prepare and circulate a list of national focal points dealing with privatization in order to facilitate exchanges among them, including the exchange of legal material and other guidelines. The secretariat has also been asked to prepare a synopsis of the activities undertaken by other international organizations.

Item 2(i) Standing Committee on Economic Cooperation among Developing Countries, first session (11 - 15 January 1993)

The Standing Committee on Economic Cooperation among Developing Countries, established pursuant to paragraph 70 of the Cartagena Commitment, held its first session from 11 to 15 January 1993. The Committee adopted its work programme as contained in annex I of the report on the session.

The Standing Committee also approved a provisional agenda for its second session (annex II) and agreed that it would meet in 1994, the exact dates to be referred to the Calendar Group.

Furthermore, the Standing Committee agreed with the Chairman's proposal concerning the manner in which arrangements for regular consultations might be conducted between the first and the second session of the Committee, which are as follows:

(a) An Intergovernmental Group of Experts, to hold consultations with interregional, regional and subregional groupings, should be organized prior to the second session of the Standing Committee, with a view to collecting relevant information from the donor community and preparing prospects for improvement of assistance programmes. Participants in ECDC programmes and projects are requested to present their developmental objectives and external assistance requirements to this intergovernmental meeting.

(b) The second session of the Committee should receive the report of the envisaged meeting with a view to identifying programmes, projects and measures for international support.

The Board may wish to take note of the report of the Standing Committee on its first session, and to endorse the work programme in annex I, including the arrangements for regular consultations.

In view of the fact that the membership of Czechoslovakia in the United Nations and its subsidiary organs ceased as of 1 January 1993 and with the admittance of the Czech Republic and Slovak Republic to the membership of the United Nations and its subsidiary organs, on 19 January 1993, the Board may wish to note that the membership of UNCTAD now stands at 184.

At the first part of thirty-ninth session, the Board confirmed the membership of the Trade and Development Board at 135.

In view of the fact that the membership of Czechoslovakia in the United Nations and its subsidiary organs ceased as of 1 January 1993, the membership of the Board now stands at 134.

Item 4(c) Arrangements for the celebration of the thirtieth anniversary of UNCTAD in 1994.

It will be recalled that, on the occasion of the twenty-fifth anniversary of UNCTAD, the Board, at the first part of its thirty-sixth session, held a special commemorative plenary meeting and, by resolution 376 (XXXVI), of 13 October 1989, adopted a Declaration on that occasion.

Taking into account the evolution of the organization since that time, particularly in the light of the outcome of the eighth session of the conference as endorsed by the General Assembly in its resolution 47/183, of 22 December 1992, the secretariat will submit, for the Board's consideration, a preliminary note containing suggestions for the celebration of the thirtieth anniversary of UNCTAD.

**GUIDELINES FOR THE EXECUTIVE SESSION OF THE
TRADE AND DEVELOPMENT BOARD**The Trade and Development Board in executive session

Pursuant to paragraph 67 of the Cartagena Commitment, the Trade and Development Board adopts the following guidelines for its meetings in executive session (hereafter referred to as "executive sessions of the Board").

1. The executive sessions of the Board will facilitate the strengthening of the policy function of the Board in adapting the organization's work to changing worldwide economic circumstances, reviewing work programmes and priorities, promoting greater efficiency and reacting to reports from its subsidiary bodies in order to give impetus to ongoing work.
2. The executive sessions will be convened at the level of Permanent Representatives at regular intervals, and at any time the President of the Board, in consultation with the Secretary-General of UNCTAD and with the members States, deems it necessary, in half-day or one day sessions. One of these sessions shall take place immediately before each part of the regular sessions of the Board. The agenda for each executive session of the Board will be agreed upon sufficiently in advance to ensure adequate preparation. Each executive session of the Board should be preceded by an appropriate consultative process.
3. The executive sessions of the Board may provide guidance to the subsidiary bodies of the Board and take action on the outcomes of the meetings of these bodies; take action on procedural and organizational matters; and provide timely preparation of the issues to be considered by the regular sessions of the Board.
