Composition of the SecretariatReport of the Secretary-General

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I. INTRODUCTION

1. The annual report of the Secretary-General on the composition of the Secretariat is submitted in accordance with a number of resolutions of the General Assembly, the most recent of which are resolutions 44/185 A of 19 December 1989 and 45/239 A of 21 December 1990. The purpose of the report is to facilitate an assessment of the distribution of the staff of the United Nations Secretariat by nationality, sex, grade and type of appointment, in the light of the principles contained in the Charter of the United Nations and the guidelines set forth by the General Assembly.

2. In resolution 46/220 of 20 December 1991, the General Assembly decided to consider personnel questions on a biennial basis in even years. The List of Staff of the United Nations Secretariat and the report on the composition of the Secretariat would be issued in odd years for information purposes.

3. The information provided in the present report can be found mainly in the statistical tables inserted throughout the text and in those contained in annex I. In addition, detailed information on staff members can be found in the List of Staff of the United Nations Secretariat (A/C.5/47/L.2), to be issued at a later date.

4. Information concerning women in the United Nations can also be found in the report of the Secretary-General to the General Assembly at the current session on the improvement of the status of women in the Secretariat. A number of statistical tables contained in the present report are also reproduced in that report to facilitate the consideration of the question of women on the basis of a single comprehensive report in accordance with the views of Member States as expressed during the deliberations on the subject in the Third and Fifth Committees.

II. COMPOSITION OF THE SECRETARIAT

A. Staff of the United Nations

5. The power of the Secretary-General to appoint staff derives from Article 101, paragraph 1, of the Charter of the United Nations, which reads:

"The staff shall be appointed by the Secretary-General under regulations established by the General Assembly".

6. There are a number of United Nations subsidiary organs which enjoy a special status granted by the General Assembly concerning the appointment of their staff. Those subsidiary organs are the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP); the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR); the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF); the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR); the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA); the

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International Trade Centre (ITC); the secretariat of the International Civil Service Commission (ICSC); the United Nations University (UNU); and the Registry of the International Court of Justice (ICJ).

Total staff of the United Nations

7. The total number of staff of the United Nations is 31,127, of whom 13,883 are assigned to the Secretariat of the United Nations and 17,244 to the secretariats of subsidiary organs (see para. 6 above). As regards the funding, 9,522 staff occupy posts financed from the regular budget and 21,605 staff occupy posts financed from extrabudgetary sources. Further details about the composition of the staff, source of funds, category and related information, can be found in table A. These data are also illustrated in figures 1 to 3.

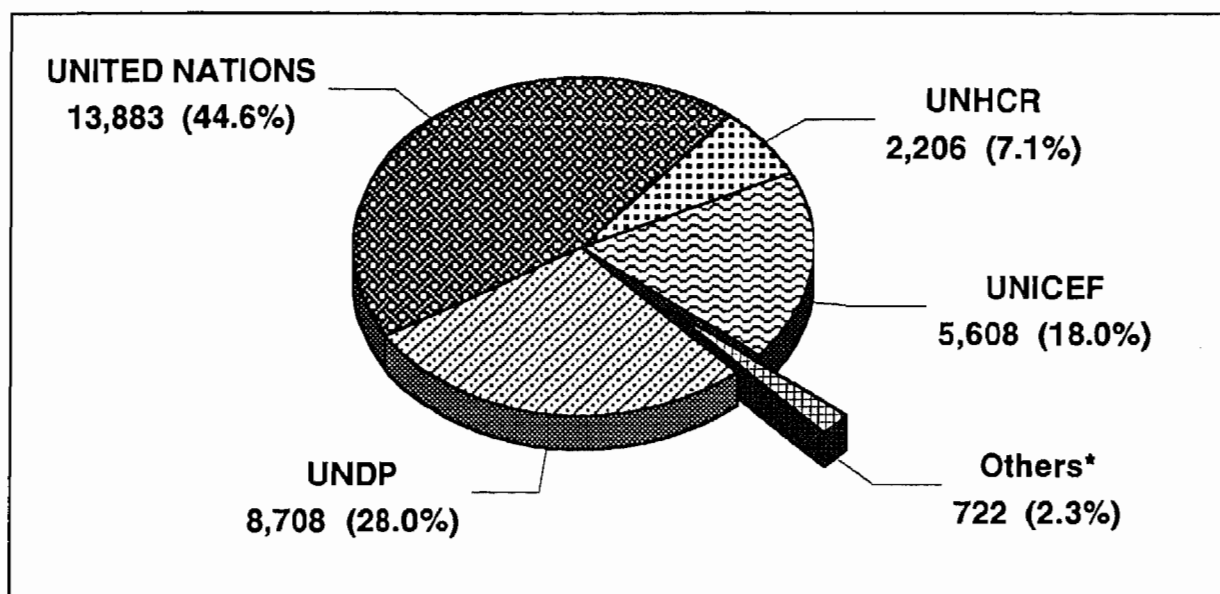

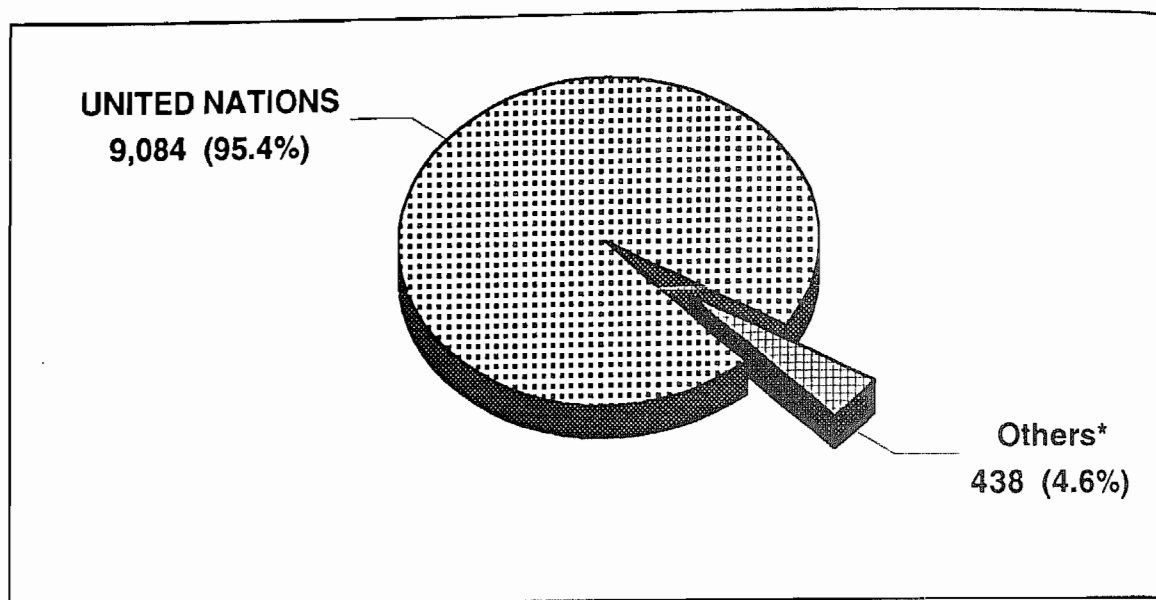
Staff of the United Nations Secretariat

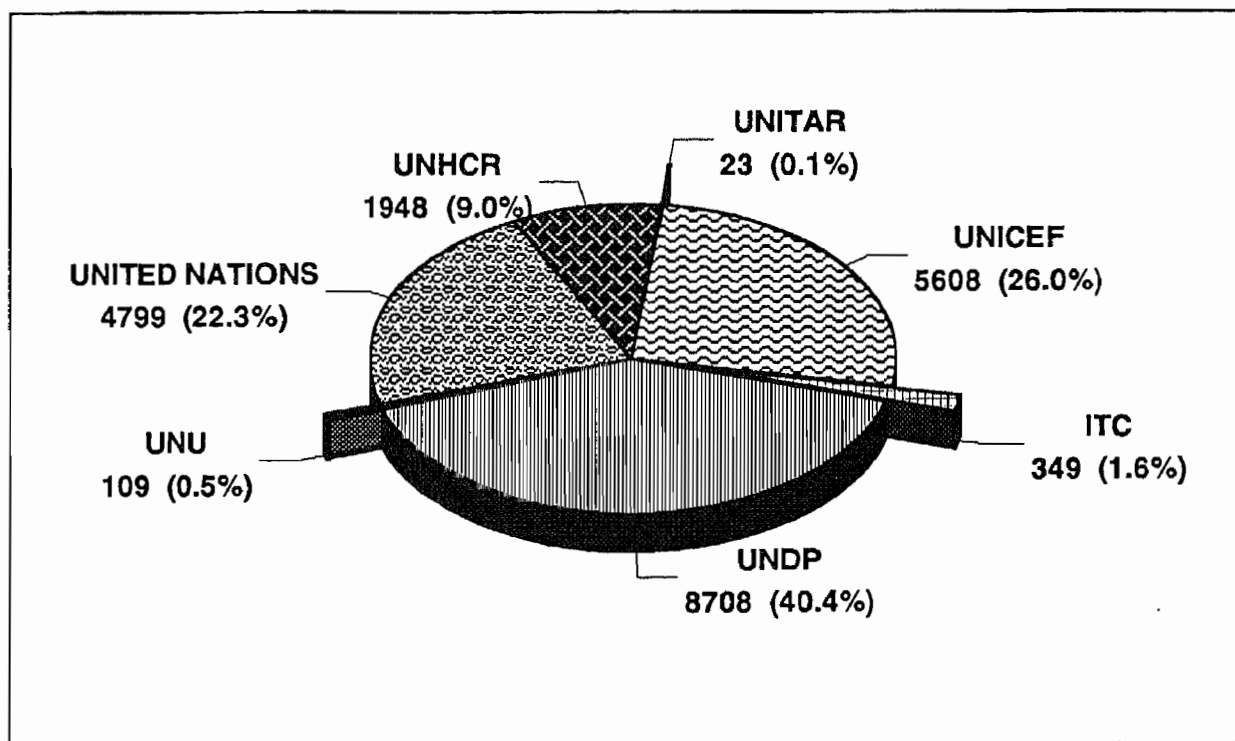
Distribution of staff in posts financed

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Principles governing the recruitment and employment of staff

8. The principles governing the recruitment and employment of staff are derived from Article 101, paragraph 3, of the Charter, which reads:

"The paramount consideration in the employment of the staff and in the determination of the conditions of service shall be the necessity of securing the highest standards of efficiency, competence, and integrity. Due regard shall be paid to the importance of recruiting the staff on as wide a geographical basis as possible."

9. These principles apply to all the staff of the United Nations, including the staff of the secretariats of United Nations subsidiary organs with special status in matters of appointment (see para. 6 above).

B. Posts subject to geographical distribution

10. A particular group of staff of the United Nations Secretariat are covered by a system of desirable ranges used as a guideline for estimating the comparative representation of the nationals of each Member State. This system has been established by the General Assembly on the basis of three factors, namely, membership, contribution and population. The staff concerned are referred to as "staff in posts subject to geographical distribution". The special characteristic of this group of staff, who currently number 2,608, is that they are directly appointed by the Secretary-General for at least one year to posts in the Professional category and above.

Staff excluded from geographical distribution

11. There are a number of staff members who are excluded from geographical distribution. The largest group is composed of staff who do not serve in the United Nations Secretariat but in the secretariats of United Nations subsidiary organs with special status in matters of appointment (see para. 7 above).

12. Within the Secretariat, the largest groups excluded are staff in posts with special language requirements, staff in the Field Service and the General Service and related categories such as Trades and Crafts, Security and Safety and Public Information Assistants. Other groups consist of staff specifically appointed for mission service; staff appointed for service limited to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) or to the United Nations Centre on Human Settlements (UNCHS); staff appointed after inter-agency consultation to posts financed on an inter-agency basis; technical cooperation project personnel; and National Officers serving at United Nations Information Centres.

13. Also excluded are staff with appointments for less than one year; staff on special leave without pay; staff on secondment to other agencies; and staff members who are permanent residents in the country of their duty station. Information on the numbers of these groups of staff can be found in table 1 in annex I.

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C. Representation of Member States

14. The representation of Member States is assessed in conformity with the system of desirable ranges. 1/ Member States fall into four categories resulting from the comparison of their ranges with the number of their nationals in posts subject to geographical distribution. These categories are: unrepresented; underrepresented; within range; and overrepresented. 2/

15. As at 30 June 1992, there were 29 unrepresented Member States, as compared with 9 on 30 June 1991. Nineteen newly admitted Member States are unrepresented. They are: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Estonia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lithuania, Marshall Islands, Micronesia (Federated States of), Republic of Korea, Republic of Moldova, San Marino, Slovenia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan. In addition, Namibia, which was within range, is now unrepresented following the separation from service of two of its nationals. Accordingly, the Member States unrepresented as at 30 June 1992 were: Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bahrain, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brunei Darussalam, Croatia, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Estonia, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lithuania, Liechtenstein, Maldives, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Namibia, Republic of Korea, Republic of Moldova, San Marino, Sao Tome and Principe, Slovenia, Solomon Islands, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan and Vanuatu.

16. On 30 June 1992, there were 21 underrepresented Member States, as compared with 24 on 30 June 1991. They were: Angola, Bahamas, Botswana, Cape Verde, Djibouti, Dominica, Guinea-Bissau, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Mongolia, Mozambique, Paraguay, Portugal, Qatar, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saudi Arabia, Spain, United Arab Emirates and Viet Nam. Germany, Romania and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, which were underrepresented, are now within range.

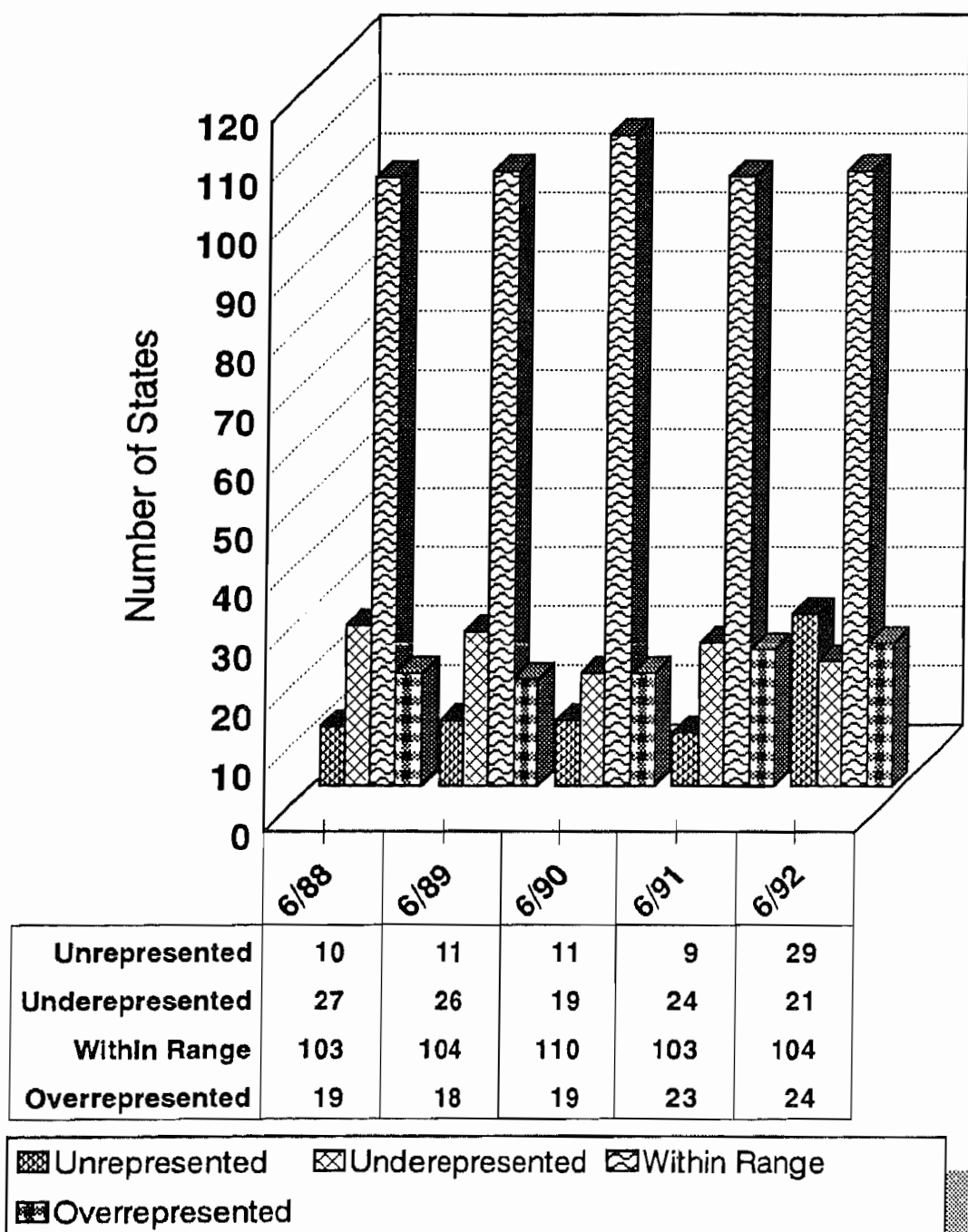
17. The changes in the representation of Member States may result not only from the appointments and separations from service of staff but also from such other factors as the adjustments of the desirable ranges resulting from an increase or decrease in the number of posts subject to geographical distribution, changes in the number of Member States, and variations in the assessed contribution of individual Member States or in their population, as well as from changes in the status of some staff members (consequent upon such actions as movements between geographic and non-geographic posts, departures on secondment or special leave without pay, returns from secondment or special leave, and changes of nationality).

18. The evolution in the comparative representation of Member States in geographic posts over the period from 30 June 1988 to 30 June 1992 is illustrated in figure 4.

D. Groupings of Member States

19. In conformity with the Assembly's request in resolution 45/239 A, the tables contained in annex I to the present report are arranged first by country, in alphabetical order, and then by major geographical region. The composition of each region is shown in annex II A. Table B shows the number of Member States in each geographical region arranged by degree of representation during the period 1988-1992.

20. Information concerning the representation of developing and other countries is given in table C, which shows the situation each year during the five-year period 1988-1992. In accordance with past practice, ad hoc desirable ranges for developing countries and other countries have been established by totalling the desirable ranges of all countries in each group (see annex II for the composition of the groups).

21. The first column of table C indicates the group and the second the year. The third and fourth columns show the combined desirable ranges and mid-point for each group. The fifth column shows the percentage of posts corresponding to the mid-point of each group. The remaining columns show the actual numbers and the percentage of posts encumbered by nationals of countries members of the group at various levels: all staff in the Professional category and above, staff at the D-1 level and above, staff at the D-2 level and above, and staff at the level of Assistant Secretary-General and above. In estimating the representation of each group, due account is taken of the actual percentage of posts encumbered by nationals of countries in the group as compared with the percentage established by reference to the mid-point of the group's ad hoc desirable range.

22. In view of the concerns of the General Assembly relating to the representation of women in senior posts, attention is also drawn to the figures between parentheses, which show the situation of women.

E. Staff at the senior levels: Principal Officer (D-1) and above

Representation of developing and other countries

23. In resolution 45/239 A, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to take every available measure to ensure, at the senior and policy-formulating levels of the Secretariat, the equitable representation of Member States, in particular of developing countries and Member States with inadequate representation at those levels, in accordance with the relevant resolutions of the Assembly, and to include relevant information in future reports on the composition of the Secretariat.

24. The action taken by the Secretary-General in this regard during the period 1988-1992 is reflected in table C. The representation of developing countries and other countries at the senior and policy-formulating levels is shown in several columns to the right of that table. More detailed information on the representation of Member States at these and other levels can be found in table 4 in annex I.

Representation in the upper echelons: Assistant Secretary-General and Under-Secretary-General)

25. In resolution 45/239 A, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General, in order to preserve the principles of equitable geographical distribution and rotation in the upper echelons of the Secretariat - Assistant Secretary-General and Under-Secretary-General - to ensure that equal opportunity is given to candidates of all Member States when making appointments to all posts in the upper echelons.

26. During the period under review, changes have taken place in the upper echelon in the context of an extensive restructuring of the Secretariat (see A/46/882, ST/SGB/248 and ST/SGB/249). Nationals of France, Italy, Poland, the Russian Federation and the United States of America were appointed or reassigned to positions previously encumbered by nationals of Canada, Finland, Poland, Sweden, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. A number of posts were eliminated as a result of the consolidation of several departments and offices. Nationals of Peru and Sweden were appointed to newly created positions.

F. Representation of women

27. At its forty-sixth session, the General Assembly adopted resolution 46/100 of 16 December 1991, on the improvement of the status of women in the Secretariat.

28. At its forty-fifth session, on the recommendation of the Fifth Committee, the General Assembly had adopted resolution 45/239 C of 21 December 1990, on the same subject. In that resolution, the Assembly urged the Secretary-General to continue his efforts to increase the number of women in

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posts subject to geographical distribution, particularly in senior policy-level and decision-making posts, in order to achieve an overall participation rate of 30 per cent by the end of 1990 and, to the extent possible to 35 per cent by 1995, taking into account the principle that the paramount consideration shall be the necessity of securing the highest standards of efficiency, competence and integrity with full respect for the principle of equitable geographical distribution.

29. In the same resolution, the Assembly also urged the Secretary-General, all things being equal and to the extent possible, to accord priority to the participation of women at the D-1 level and above with a view to increasing the participation rate of women in posts at the D-1 level and above to 25 per cent of the total within the overall participation rate of women in 35 per cent of posts subject to geographical distribution by 1995.

30. In the same resolution, the Assembly reiterated its request that the Secretary-General make every effort to increase the representation of women from developing countries, in particular at the D-1 level and above.

31. The efforts to meet the requests of the Assembly concerning women continue. As at 30 June 1992, the number of women in geographic posts was 797 or 30.6 per cent. Table 3A in annex I shows the distribution of men and women by region and level.

32. The evolution of the proportion of women in geographic posts between 30 June 1988 - when it was 26.3 per cent - and 30 June 1992 is shown in tables D1 and D2, which also show women staff for each region as percentages of all staff (table D1) and as percentages of women staff only (table D2). The data are also illustrated in figures 5 and 6.

33. The number and percentage of women in geographic posts and in posts with special language requirements on 30 June 1982 and on 30 June 1992 is shown in table E. The percentage of women in geographic posts has risen from 29.2 per cent to 30.6 per cent over this period. The percentage of women in language posts has moved from 33.8 per cent to 34.8 per cent over the same period. Figure 7 shows how the percentage of women in geographic posts has increased between 1982 and 1992.

34. Table 12, which reflects the distribution of men and women within each organizational element of the Secretariat, will be issued at a later date together with the List of Staff.

35. The number, sex, nationality and level of the staff appointed to geographic posts during the reporting period are shown in table 6 of annex I. Information on the appointment of men and women is also contained in table F.

36. Additional information on the representation of women can be found in the report of the Secretary-General to the General Assembly at its forty-seventh session on the improvement of the status of women in the Secretariat.

(June 1988-June 1992)

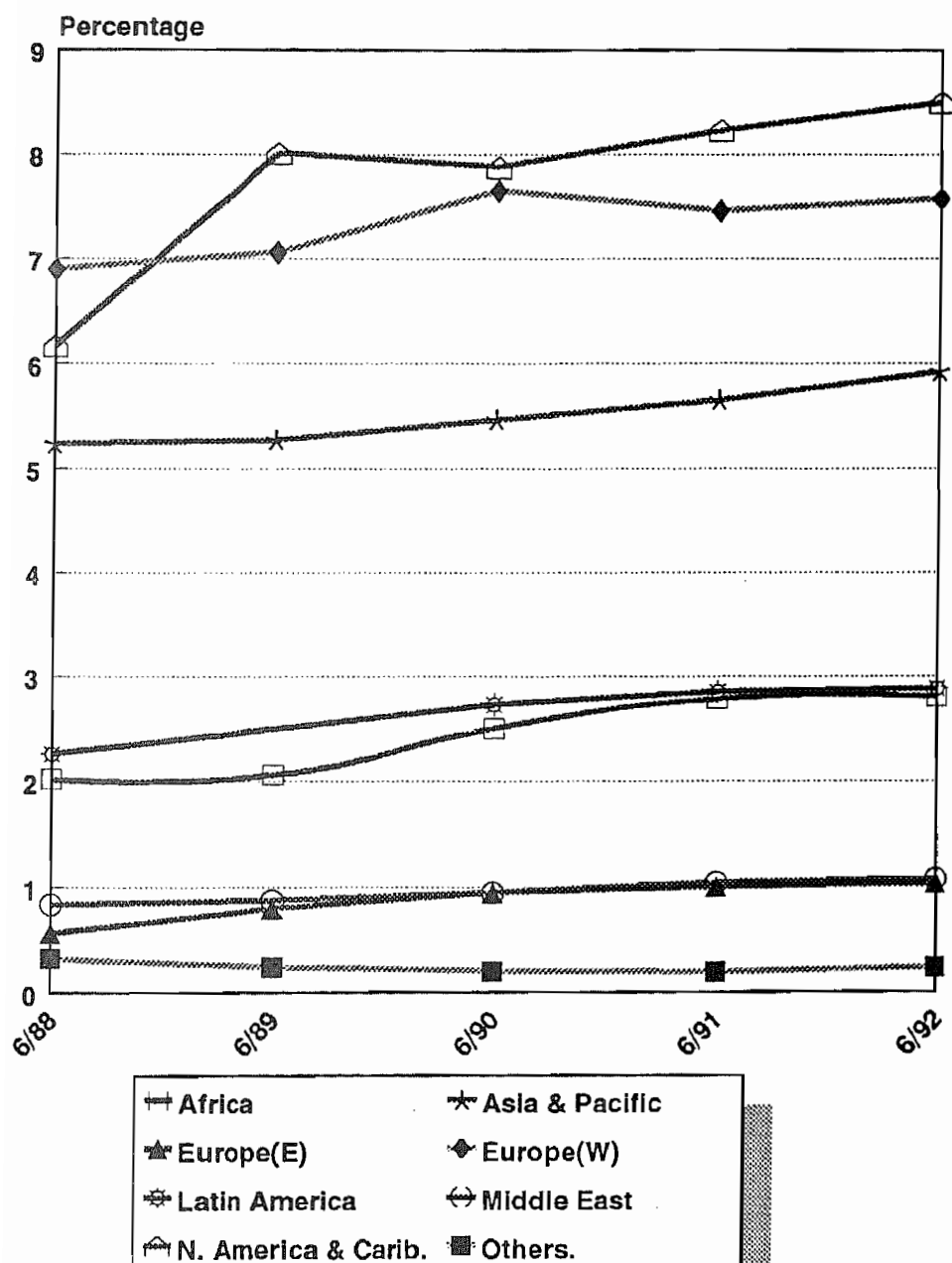

(June 1988-June 1992)

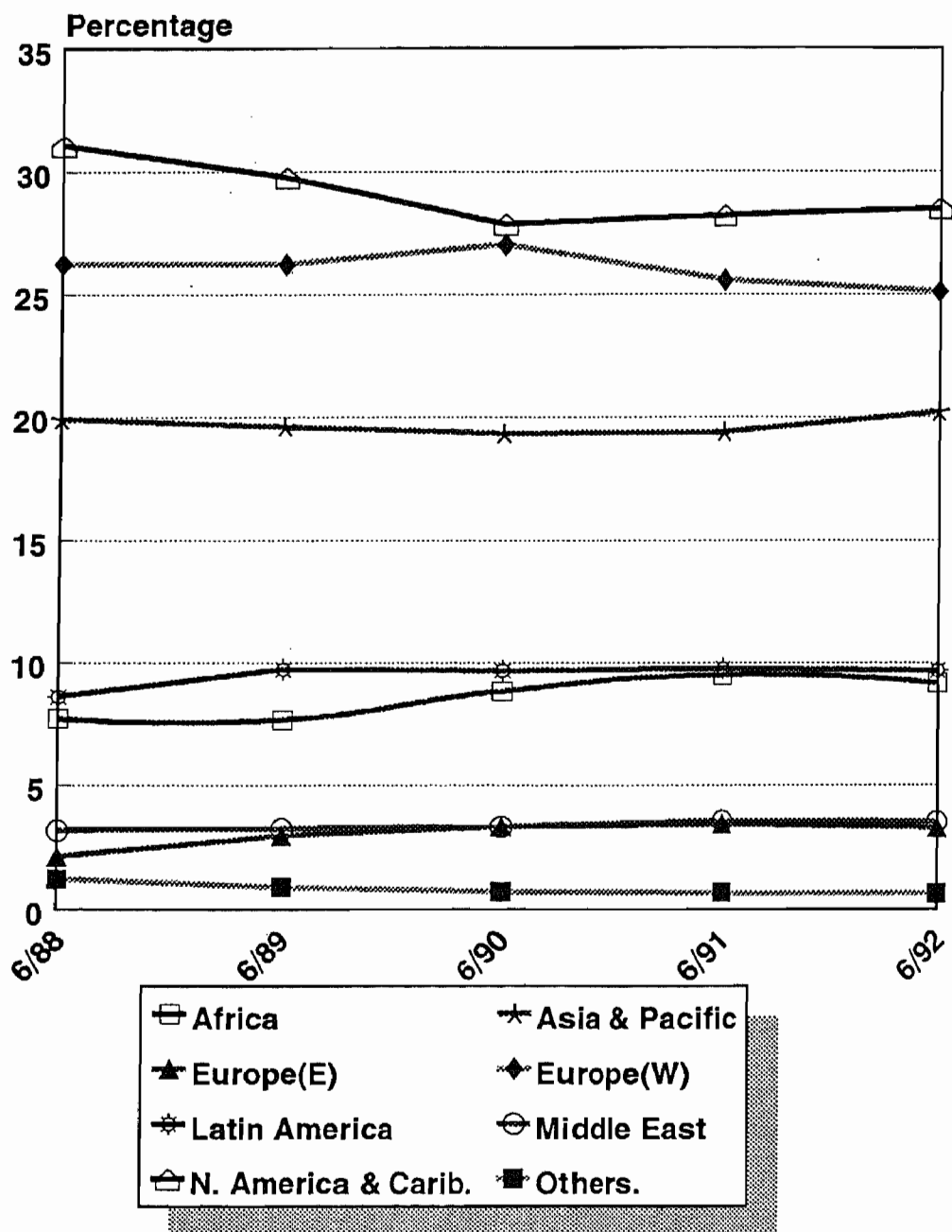

geographical distribution, 1982-1992

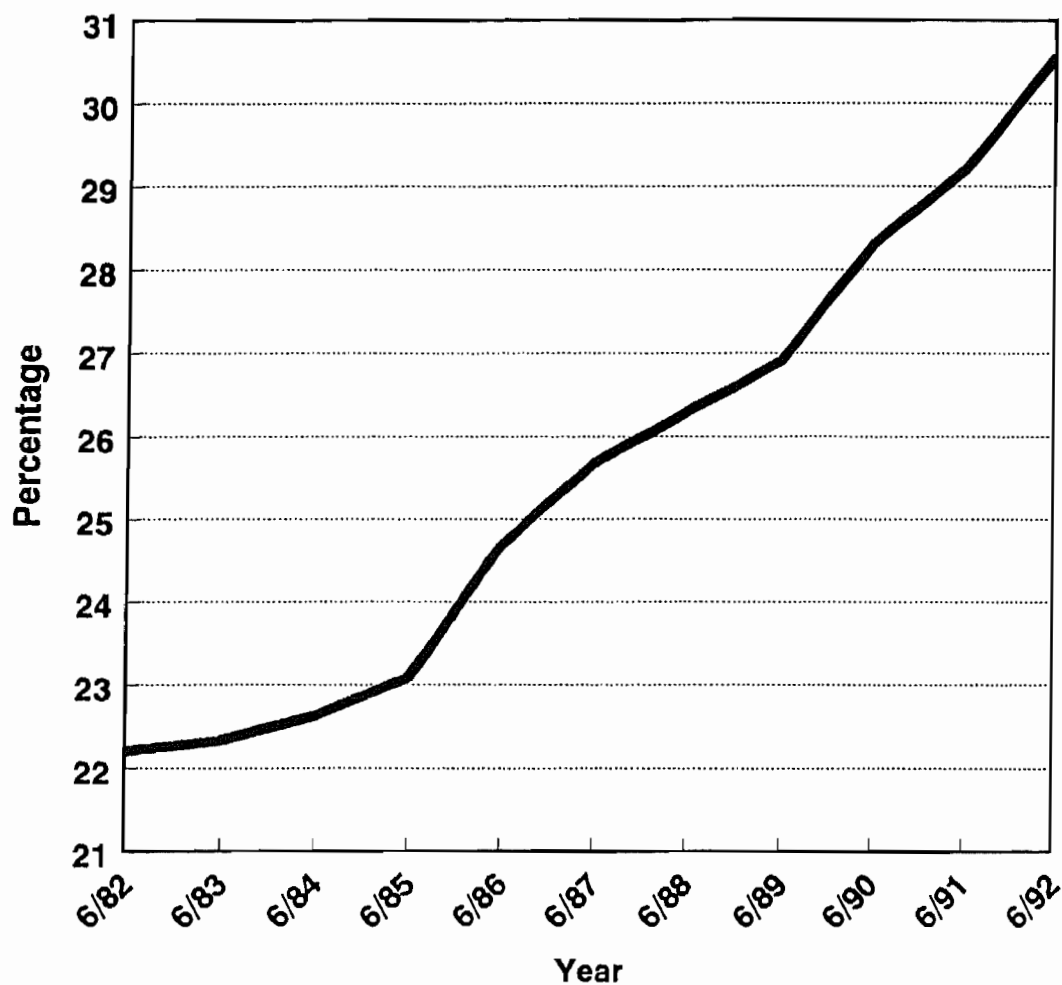

G. Distribution of staff in posts financed from
extrabudgetary funds

37. In resolution 45/239 A the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to include in the report on the composition of the Secretariat to be submitted to the Assembly at its forty-seventh session statistical tables indicating the nationality of staff serving in posts financed from extrabudgetary resources in the Secretariat. This is understood not to include United Nations subsidiary organs that have delegated authority in matters of appointment of the staff as outlined in paragraph 6 above.

38. Pursuant to the request of the Assembly, table G shows the nationality of staff serving in extrabudgetary posts as at 30 June 1992. It is important to note that the source of financing of a post (regular budget or extrabudgetary funds) does not of itself determine whether a post is subject to geographical distribution. Whereas many regular-budget posts are excluded from geography (such as language and others), extrabudgetary posts are subject to geographical distribution unless expressly excluded for the reasons given in paragraphs 10 to 13 above.

39. The report of the Secretary-General on the extrabudgetary resources of the United Nations (A/46/545) contains information on this subject. Of special interest in the context of the present report is section VII, "Improved transparency in the presentation of extrabudgetary resources", which describes the work being carried out in connection with the introduction of the Integrated Management Information System.

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H. Recruitment activities

Appointments to posts subject to geographical distribution during the period 1 July 1991 to 30 June 1992

40. In resolution 45/239 A, the General Assembly urged the Secretary-General, whenever making appointments at all levels to posts subject to geographical distribution, to make every effort to recruit nationals of unrepresented and underrepresented Member States, bearing in mind also the need to increase the number of staff recruited from Member States below the mid-point of their desirable ranges.

41. In February 1992, the Secretary-General announced his decision to suspend external recruitment for posts in the Professional category until further notice (see ST/SGB/247). He also stated that all exceptions to this suspension would have to be authorized by the Assistant Secretary-General for Human Resources Management and would be limited to an absolute minimum.

42. During the reporting period (1 July 1991 to 30 June 1992) 128 appointments were made to posts subject to geographical distribution. 3/ Of those 128 appointments, 29 or 22.7 per cent were of nationals of underrepresented Member States; 86 or 67.2 per cent were of nationals of within-range Member States; 13 or 10.2 per cent were of nationals of overrepresented Member States. 4/ Further details concerning the number and levels of these appointments can be found in paragraphs 43 to 48 below and in table 6 in annex I.

National competitive examinations

43. Appointments to posts subject to geographical distribution during the reporting period included those of 36 candidates who were successful in national competitive examinations for posts at the P-1 and P-2 levels. They were selected through examinations held in Australia, Brazil, Burundi, the Central African Republic, Czechoslovakia, Germany, Hungary, Iceland, Japan, New Zealand, the Netherlands, Nicaragua and Romania.

44. These appointments account for 28.1 per cent of all appointments to posts subject to geographical distribution during the reporting period. They included 18 women, representing 50 per cent of these appointments.

45. Nineteen candidates (4 women and 15 men) were recruited at the P-1 and P-2 levels outside the context of national competitive examinations.

46. Competitive examinations for posts at the P-1 and P-2 levels were also held in Albania, Bahrain, Costa Rica, Dominica, Grenada, Honduras, Italy and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines. A number of successful candidates in these examinations are currently under recruitment.

47. National competitive examinations for posts at the P-1 and P-2 levels are currently under way for nationals of Germany, Japan, Liechtenstein, Mongolia,

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Namibia, Oman, the Republic of Korea, the Russian Federation, Saudi Arabia, Spain and the United States of America.

48. Competitive examinations for posts at the P-3 level were held in Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Italy and Japan. A number of candidates successful in these examinations are currently under recruitment. National competitive examinations for posts at the P-3 level are under way in Finland, Germany, Japan, the Russian Federation and the United States of America. A report on competitive examination at the P-3 level appears in document A/C.5/47/5.

Recruitment of women

49. Between 1 July 1991 and 30 June 1992, 50 women were appointed to posts subject to geographical distribution, representing 39.1 per cent of the 128 appointments made during the reporting period, as compared with 57 or 33.5 per cent of the 170 appointments made during the previous reporting period. Women from developing countries accounted for 12 appointments, that is to say, 24 per cent of the 50 appointments of women made during the reporting period.

Notes

1/ The desirable ranges for the representation of Member States are shown in table 4 in annex I.

2/ Member States are unrepresented when none of their nationals is in a post subject to geographical distribution; underrepresented when the number of their nationals in these posts is below the lower limit of their ranges; within range when the number of their nationals in these posts is within the limits of their ranges; and overrepresented when the number of their nationals in these posts exceeds the upper limit of their ranges.

3/ In the compilation of statistics for the present report, an appointment to a post subject to geographical distribution is understood as the granting to a staff member of an appointment for one year or more, either through initial or other recruitment involving service for at least this period; or through the completion of at least one year of service in such a post.

4/ The figures cited in this paragraph are computed on the basis of the degree of representation of each Member State at the end of the previous reporting year, on 30 June 1991, as communicated to the General Assembly in the latest report of the Secretary-General on the composition of the Secretariat (A/46/370). Although the fluctuations in the representation of Member States during the reporting year are not directly taken into account in this computation, they are estimated monthly and used in monitoring geographical distribution and in planning recruitment.
