ORGANIZATION OF WORK

Note by the Secretariat

1. In order to assist the Sixth Committee in the organization of its work, the Secretariat finds it appropriate, in the light of General Assembly resolutions 1898 (XVIII) of 11 November 1963 and 32/71 of 9 December 1977 and of rule 99 (b) of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, to draw the Sixth Committee's attention to the following.

I. ITEMS ALLOCATED TO THE SIXTH COMMITTEE

2. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 23 September 1994, the General Assembly decided to allocate 14 items to the Sixth Committee. The titles of these items and their numbers are reproduced in the letter dated 23 September 1994 from the President of the Assembly addressed to the Chairman of the Sixth Committee (A/C.6/49/1).

II. DOCUMENTATION RELATING TO THE ITEMS ALLOCATED TO THE SIXTH COMMITTEE

3. The following table lists the documents of the forty-ninth session of the General Assembly relating to the items allocated to the Sixth Committee. 1/ It includes references to the reports of commissions or committees and the reports that are to be submitted by the Secretary-General pursuant to resolutions or decisions of preceding sessions of the Assembly, as well as to the documents circulated under the agenda items allocated to the Sixth Committee, in accordance with requests of Member States. III. DATE FOR CONCLUDING THE WORK OF THE COMMITTEE, ORDER AND APPROXIMATE DATES OF CONSIDERATION OF ITEMS

4. Rule 99 (b) of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly provides that:

"Each Main Committee, taking into account the closing date for the session fixed by the General Assembly on the recommendation of the General Committee, shall adopt its own priorities and meet as may be necessary to complete the consideration of the items referred to it. It shall at the beginning of the session adopt a programme of work indicating, if possible, a target date for the conclusion of its work, the approximate dates of consideration of items and the number of meetings to be allocated to each item."

5. At its 1st meeting, on 21 September 1994, the General Committee decided to recommend that the forty-ninth session should recess not later than Tuesday, 20 December 1994, and conclude on Monday, 18 September 1995. Under the circumstances, it appears advisable that the Sixth Committee should arrange its schedule of meetings in such a way that it will conclude its work not later than Friday, 25 November 1994.

6. As regards agenda items 133 to 145, the Sixth Committee, taking into account the pattern followed in the order of consideration of items at recent sessions of the General Assembly, may wish to consider, for the purpose of adopting its programme of work, the following timetable, drawn up on the basis of previous programmes of work adopted by the Committee, which indicates approximate dates of consideration of agenda items referred to it.

a/ During the period from 26 to 30 September 1994, consultations on the item on the jurisdictional immunities of States and their property should be held in accordance with General Assembly decision 48/413 of 9 December 1993 (see para. 8 (c) below). The Sixth Committee may therefore wish to keep to a minimum the number of meetings it will hold during that period.

b/ Meetings of the States Parties to the Convention on the Law of the Sea are scheduled to take place on 21 and 22 November to discuss the establishment of the International Tribunal of the Law of the Sea.

7. As regards item 157, "Question of criteria for the granting of observer status in the General Assembly", the Sixth Committee may wish to consider it at an early stage in the session, for example, during the week of 3 to 7 October 1994, bearing in mind that the item was included in the agenda of the current session as an additional item, that is, one of an important and urgent character.

IV. ESTABLISHMENT OF WORKING GROUPS AND HOLDING OF CONSULTATIONS

8. In connection with the establishment of subcommittees or working groups and the holding of consultations for the purpose of facilitating the work, it should be borne in mind that the General Assembly took the following decisions at its forty-eighth session:

(a) As regards agenda item 136, "United Nations Decade of International Law", the General Assembly requested the Working Group on the United Nations Decade of International Law to continue to work at the forty-ninth session in accordance with its mandate and methods of work (resolution 48/30 of 9 December 1993);

(b) Concerning agenda item 141, "Question of responsibility for attacks on United Nations and associated personnel and measures to ensure that those responsible for such attacks are brought to justice", the General Assembly recommended that a working group be re-established in the framework of the Sixth Committee at its forty-ninth session in the event that further work is required for the elaboration of a draft convention (resolution 48/37 of 9 December 1993). In the light of this recommendation, the Ad Hoc Committee on the Elaboration of an International Convention Dealing with the Safety and Security of United Nations and Associated Personnel, at the end of its second session (1-12 August 1994), recommended to the General Assembly that it re-establish a

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working group, which would meet for a two-week period, preferably in October or November (A/49/22, para. 29);

(c) With respect to agenda item 143, "Convention on jurisdictional immunities of States and their property", the General Assembly decided that consultations should be held in the framework of the Sixth Committee during one week at the beginning of its forty-ninth session, namely, from 26 to 30 September 1994.

9. Since the conference services to be provided for meetings of working groups and for the holding of informal consultations are those allocated to the Sixth Committee, it is important that such meetings and consultations be held in place of, rather than in addition to, meetings of the Committee.

V. DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF DRAFT RESOLUTIONS WITH FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

10. According to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, "no resolution involving expenditure shall be recommended by a committee for approval by the General Assembly unless it is accompanied by an estimate of expenditures prepared by the Secretary-General". It is therefore imperative that the Main Committees allow sufficient time for the preparation of the estimates of expenditures by the Secretariat and for their consideration by the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and by the Fifth Committee. Under the circumstances, if Friday, 25 November 1994, is accepted as the concluding date for the work of the Sixth Committee (see para. 5 above), Wednesday, 9 November 1993, would have to be considered as the mandatory deadline for submission to the Fifth Committee of draft resolutions with financial implications.

VI. CONFERENCE RESOURCES AVAILABLE

11. The available conference facilities will, in principle, enable the Committee to hold an average of seven plenary meetings per week; normally, morning meetings will be held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and afternoon meetings from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.

12. In order to avoid difficulties in the organization of services for the meetings of regional groups of the Committee, it is suggested that all requests for such meetings be channelled to the Planning and Meetings Services Section through the Secretary of the Committee.
