(a) 21 cases were prosecuted under the Dangerous Drugs Decree. Convictions were obtained in 17 cases; the accused in 3 cases were acquitted and 1 case is pending trial in court.

(b) 4 Arabs and 18 Africans were involved in these cases.

(c) In 19 cases the accused persons were prosecuted for possession of Indian hemp (bhang) and in 2 cases for possession of opium.

(d) Approximately 586.2 grammes of Indian Hemp and 3.9 grammes of opium were confiscated and destroyed.
