Vanu Gopala MENON

Mr. Vanu Gopala Menon is a career foreign service officer who is presently serving as Senior Assistant Director in the Singapore Ministry of Foreign Affairs. In his last posting abroad, Mr. Menon served as the First Secretary in the Permanent Mission of Singapore to the United Nations, from March 1988 to April 1991.

Mr. Menon graduated with a degree in Bachelor of Business Administration with a Second Class (Upper Division) Honours degree in 1985, and subsequently joined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He was first elected in 1988 to the United Nations Committee on Contributions for the period 1989 to 1991. In 1991, he was re-elected to a second term in the Committee on Contributions for the period 1992 to 1994.

He was appointed the Foreign Secretary of India (i.e., the Head of the Diplomatic Service and the Official Head of the Foreign Ministry).

Has attended 14 sessions of the United Nations General Assembly, and represented India, inter alia, on the Security Council, the Economic and Social Council, the Human Rights Commission, the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO), the Population Commission and the United Nations Committee for Programme and Coordination.

Member of various Indian delegations to the Commonwealth Prime Ministers Conference (at Ottawa, Singapore and Kuala Lumpur); and meetings of the Foreign Ministers of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries.

In his personal capacity, served as a member of the United Nations Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (1964-1970); a member of several inspection teams on behalf of the United Nations Secretary-General (for examining the work of United Nations peace-keeping forces in Gaza) and of the executive heads of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), the International Labour Organization (ILO) and the World Health Organization (WHO).
