Note by the Secretary-General

1. The Commission on Human Rights, in its resolution 1994/56 of 4 March 1994, on the composition of the staff of the Centre for Human Rights, requested the Secretary-General to present to the Fifth Committee of the General Assembly at its forty-ninth session, through the Economic and Social Council, a report on the current geographical distribution of posts in the staff of the Centre for Human Rights. The relevant report submitted to the Economic and Social Council was contained in document E/1994/117.
2. It should be noted that the annual report of the Secretary-General on the composition of the Secretariat is submitted in accordance with a number of resolutions of the General Assembly, the most recent of which are resolutions 44/185 A of 19 December 1989, 45/239 A of 21 December 1990 and 47/226 of 8 April 1993. The purpose of that report is to facilitate an assessment of the distribution of the staff of the United Nations Secretariat by nationality, sex, grade and type of appointment, in the light of the principles contained in the Charter of the United Nations and the guidelines set forth by the Assembly. The report of the Secretary-General on the composition of the Secretariat for 1993 was contained in document A/48/559.
3. In this context, it should be emphasized that an accurate assessment of the composition of the staff of the United Nations Secretariat is considered only on a global basis for the Secretariat as a whole and not for a particular unit of it.
4. The information on the current geographical distribution of the Professional posts of the Centre for Human Rights is contained in the annex of this report, which is submitted pursuant to paragraph 3 of Commission on Human Rights resolution 1994/56.
