Corrigendum concerning Costa Rica

1. Since the publication of the above report, information has been received by the Secretary-General that, according to the Political Constitution of Costa Rica of 7 November 1949, articles 90, 93 and 108, women have been given the same political rights as men.
2. The following corrections should therefore be made in document E/CN.6/131:
In paragraph 3, fourth line, the number of countries where women may vote and be elected to public office should be changed from fifty-two to fifty-three.
In paragraph 4, first line, the number twenty-two should be changed to twenty.
In paragraph 4 (c), second line, the number thirteen should be changed to eleven.
