Item 2(d) Reconvening of the Joint UNCTAD/IMO IGE on Maritime
Liens and Mortgages and Related Subjects

Following General Assembly resolution 46/213, the United Nations/International Maritime Organization Conference of Plenipotentiaries on a Convention on Maritime Liens and Mortgages was convened in Geneva from 19 April to 6 May 1993. The Conference, having considered the draft convention prepared by the Joint UNCTAD/IMO Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Maritime Liens and Mortgages and Related Subjects, adopted by consensus the International Convention on Maritime Liens and Mortgages, 1993.

The Convention is considered an important step towards improving conditions for ship financing and promoting international uniformity in the field of maritime liens and mortgages. It will be deposited with the Secretary-General of the United Nations and will be open for signature from 1 September 1993 to 31 August 1994. It will enter into force six months following the date on which 10 States have expressed their consent to be bound by it.

The Conference also adopted a resolution (A/CONF.162/L.6) in which it recommended that "the relevant bodies of UNCTAD and IMO, in the light of the outcome of the Conference, reconvene the Joint Intergovernmental Group with a view to examining the possible review of the International Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules Relating to the Arrest of Sea-going Ships, 1952 and invite the secretariats of UNCTAD and IMO, in consultation with relevant non-governmental organizations, such as the Comité Maritime International, to prepare the necessary documentation for the meetings of the Group".

It will be recalled that the Joint UNCTAD/IMO Intergovernmental Group of Experts had been established pursuant to resolution 6(XI) of the UNCTAD Working Group on International Shipping Legislation and its mandate included the "review of the maritime liens and mortgages Conventions and related enforcement procedures, such as arrest" (TD/B/C.4/ISL/53, annex I). The Joint Intergovernmental Group, however, having briefly discussed the subject, considered that, in view of the close interlinkage between the Arrest Convention of 1952 and the future maritime liens and mortgages Convention, any review or amendment of the Arrest Convention would be premature at that stage and therefore

recommended that any such review be postponed until after the final adoption of the Maritime Liens and Mortgages Convention by the Conference of Plenipotentiaries (TD/B/C.4/AC.8/27, para. 16).

Moreover, the Standing Committee on Developing Services Sectors: Fostering Competitive Services Sectors in Developing Countries - Shipping, also included in its work programme the "study [of] possible amendment of the 1952 Convention on Arrest of Ships jointly with IMO, subject to the agreement by the Joint UNCTAD/IMO Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Maritime Liens and Mortgages and Related Subjects and following the United Nations/IMO Conference on Plenipotentiaries on Maritime Liens and Mortgages" (TD/B/CN.4/13, annex I, Section C(12)).

In view of the above, the Trade and Development Board may wish to consider the reconvening of the Joint UNCTAD/IMO Intergovernmental Group of Experts in order to examine the possible review of the International Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules Relating to the Arrest of Sea-going Ships, 1952.

Item 3(a) Treatment of new States members of UNCTAD

Item 3(e) Approval of the terms of reference of the Ad Hoc Working Group to explore the issue of structural adjustment for the transition to disarmament

It will be recalled that, at the first part of its thirty-ninth session, by decision 399(XXXIX) of 9 October 1992, the Board established an Ad Hoc Working Group to explore the issue of structural adjustment for the transition to disarmament.

At the second part of its thirty-ninth session, the Board agreed to request the President of the thirty-ninth session of the Board to conduct, for about two days in the week 14-18 June 1993, informal consultations on the draft terms of reference and the timetable of the Ad Hoc Working Group with a view to facilitating a prompt decision on this issue by the Board.

Also at the second part of its thirty-ninth session, the Board requested the Secretary-General of UNCTAD to prepare revised draft terms of reference of the Ad Hoc Working Group, taking into account views and statements on this issue, as well as the compendium of comments submitted by member States, and to circulate both documents well in advance of the informal consultations of the President of the Board. The Secretary-General of UNCTAD accordingly addressed an appropriate communication, dated 8 April 1993, to States members of UNCTAD, requesting replies by 26 April 1993.^{1/}

The Board also agreed that, at the first part of its fortieth session, it would establish the terms of reference of the Ad Hoc Working Group to explore the issue of structural adjustment for the transition to disarmament, as well as its timetable, and suggested that the first session of the Ad Hoc Working Group should take place as early as possible in 1994.

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^{1/} In view of the fact that very few replies had been received to date, the Consultations of the Secretary-General of UNCTAD, on 1 June 1993, requested the President of the Board to postpone his consultations until some time in September, prior to the first part of the fortieth session of the Board, in order to allow time for more States members to respond.

Item 3(h) Preparations for the thirtieth anniversary of UNCTAD in 1994

At its second (pre-sessional) executive session on 5 March 1993, the Board had before it a note by the UNCTAD secretariat entitled "Arrangements for the celebration of the thirtieth anniversary of UNCTAD in 1994" (TD/B/EX(2)/INF.2). The Board agreed that the President and the regional coordinators and China should hold consultative meetings with the secretariat on the preparations for the celebration of the thirtieth anniversary.

At the Consultations of the Secretary-General of UNCTAD on 1 June 1993, it was agreed that, given the global interest in this event, the President's consultative meetings should be expanded to embrace all interested delegations. A series of open-ended consultations should therefore be held, the first of which should be convened in the latter part of August 1993.

The outcome of these consultations will be reported to the Board.
