REPORT OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL CONCERNING HAITI

Report of the Secretary-General

Addendum

1. In my report to the Security Council of 21 September 1993 (S/26480), I indicated in paragraph 26 that I would submit, as soon as possible, an addendum to the report including a statement of the financial implications for the United Nations Mission in Haiti.
2. Should the Security Council approve my recommendation for the establishment of the United Nations Mission in Haiti, it is estimated that the total cost of the operation for a six-month period would amount to \$49,856,000 gross ^{1/} and would include 99 international and 271 local civilian staff, 700 military contingent personnel, including military trainers and 567 police monitors. A breakdown of the estimated cost by main categories of expenditure is provided for information purposes in the annex to the present addendum.
3. It would be my recommendation to the General Assembly, that should the Security Council decide to establish the United Nations Mission in Haiti, the costs relating thereto should be considered an expense of the Organization to be borne by Member States in accordance with Article 17, paragraph 2, of the Charter of the United Nations and that the assessments to be levied on Member States should be credited to a special account to be established for this purpose.
