Letter dated 9 April 1994 from the President of the
Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina addressed to the
President of the Security Council

Today, at the initiative of the United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR) a meeting took place at the Sarajevo airport between the representatives of the legitimate Government of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the representatives of the Serb insurgents. At this meeting, UNPROFOR submitted a draft agreement calling for a 14-day cease-fire throughout the territory of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina and immediate cessation of attacks against the "safe area" of Gorazde.

The Serb side refused to accept and sign this document, while simultaneously they continued attacks against the safe area of Gorazde with the same intensity.

Our defence forces are resisting the militarily and technically better-equipped enemy. Villages around the town of Gorazde are inflamed and the number of civilian casualties has increased.

We urge the Security Council without any further delay to take measures in accordance with its resolution 836 (1993).
