Addendum 1 - Update of UNHCR Programme and
Funding Projections for 1995 and 1996

(submitted by the High Commissioner)

I. INTRODUCTION

1. An update of UNHCR programme expenditure and funding projections for 1995 and tentative estimates for the 1996 General Programmes target was presented to the 20 June 1995 meeting of the Sub-Committee on Administrative and Financial Matters (EC/1995/SC.2/CRP.19 refers). A further update is reflected in document A/AC.96/846 (UNHCR Activities Financed by Voluntary Funds: Report for 1994 - 1995 and Proposed Programmes and Budget for 1996, Parts I to VII) and document A/AC.96/845/Part I (Overview of UNHCR Activities 1994 - 1996 - Part I. Consolidated Programmatic, Budgetary and Financial Information). The present document provides further updated information (as at 1 September 1995) for 1995 and 1996 General Programmes, and 1995 Special Programmes.

2. The current budgetary estimates for 1995 General Programmes remain at \$ 428.7 million, of which \$ 25.0 million are for the Emergency Fund, with unallocated balances remaining of \$ 10.9 million for the General Allocation for Voluntary Repatriation and \$ 9.1 million in the Programme Reserve as of 1 May 1995. An update on the use of these funding sources is provided in paragraphs 8 to 10 below.

3. The initial budgetary estimates for 1996 General Programmes stand at \$ 445.3 million, of which \$ 25.0 million is for the Emergency Fund, \$ 20.0 million for the General Allocation for Voluntary Repatriation and \$ 42.9 million for the Programme Reserve.

4. In documentation presented to the forty-fifth session of the Executive Committee, UNHCR initially projected a volume of 1995 Special Programmes activities amounting to some \$ 695.4 million, excluding, *inter alia*, operational requirements for the Burundi/Rwanda emergency (Table X of document A/AC.96/824 refers). These projections were updated for subsequent Sub-Committee meetings. The most recent update was that found in Table VII of the Overview document (A/AC.96/845/Part I). That update, as at 15 May 1995, showed revised programme needs under Special Programmes amounting to \$ 839.5 million. A further update is attached as Annex 1 to this document and shows needs under Special Programmes, as at 1 September 1995, amounting to \$ 847.6 million.

5. The present update provides additional information on 1995 General Programmes in Part II, whilst Part III deals with programme requirements under General Programmes in 1996. Special Programmes are dealt with in Part IV, while Part V sets out total funding projections for 1995.

II. 1995 GENERAL PROGRAMMES

6. At its forty-fifth session, the Executive Committee approved a target of \$ 415.4 million for General Programmes for 1995. Subsequently, in its meeting of 17 January 1995, the Executive Committee approved an increase in this target to \$ 428.7 million. This estimate included \$ 33.7 million as a Programme Reserve, \$ 25.0 million for the Emergency Fund and \$ 20.0 million for the General Allocation for Voluntary Repatriation.

7. A programme/budgetary review carried out in August 1995 confirmed that the 1995 General Programmes budgets remain valid for the majority of country programmes. New or additional needs in some countries due to caseload increases or exchange-rate losses have, for the most part, been compensated by exchange-rate gains and programme changes in other countries. Consolidation of budgetary changes required as a result of the August review is still ongoing. However, any necessary additional requirements will be met through savings achieved through low rates of implementation in some countries.

8. As regards the Programme Reserve, which stood at \$ 9.1 million on 30 April 1995, some \$ 4.9 million have since been allocated, mainly for Ethiopia, Sudan, Malta, Pakistan and for the Fund for International Field Staff Housing and Basic Amenities, thus leaving a balance of \$ 4.2 million available for the remainder of the year. An update on the use of the Programme Reserve is provided in Annex 2 of this document; it replaces Table IV of document A/AC.96/845/Part I.

9. With regard to the General Allocation for Voluntary Repatriation, allocations totalling \$ 11.2 million had been made by the end of August 1995. Between 1 May and 31 August 1995, further allocations were made, leaving a balance of \$ 8.8 million available for the remainder of the year. An update on the use of the General Allocation is provided in Annex 3 of this document; it replaces Table V of document A/AC.96/845/Part I.

10. UNHCR made extensive use of the Emergency Fund during 1995. By 30 April 1995, \$ 11.3 million had been allocated from the Fund for emergency needs. During the period 1 May to 31 August 1995, new and ongoing emergencies have called for further allocations, primarily for Guinea (\$ 1.1 million) and Uganda (\$ 0.8 million). Total allocations as of 31 August 1995 amounted to \$ 13.4 million, taking into account reimbursements of some allocations totalling \$ 0.4 million to the Fund, leaving a balance of \$ 11.6 million available for the remainder of the year. An update on the use of the Emergency Fund is provided in Annex 4; it replaces Table VI of document A/AC.96/845/Part I.

III. 1996 GENERAL PROGRAMMES

11. Details on the initial budgetary estimates for 1996 General Programmes of \$ 445.3 million are provided in Parts I to VII of document A/AC.96/846. A comprehensive programme review will be carried out between October and December 1995, and updated requirements and funding projections will be presented to the Sub-Committee in due course.

IV. SPECIAL PROGRAMMES

12. As regards Special Programmes, projections for 1995 are now some \$ 1.9 million lower than those presented to the Sub-Committee in June 1995 (EC/1995/SC.2/CRP.19 refers), mainly because the budgetary estimates have been decreased by \$ 26.5 million for the Burundi/Rwanda emergency in accordance with the revised appeal (July 1995) which partially offset the

increased requirements for the Special Operation in the Former Yugoslavia of \$ 34.2 million.

13. Initial Special Programmes needs for 1996 stand at \$ 324.8 million as projected in June 1995 (Table VII of document A/AC.96/845/Part I refers). It has to be noted however, that these projections are not comprehensive and will have to be updated as requirements evolve. This concerns in particular the Burundi/Rwanda emergency and the Special Operation in the Former Yugoslavia. In the light of the Regional Operations Review (November 1995), updated 1996 estimates will be presented to the Executive Committee in January 1996.

V. TOTAL PROGRAMME AND FUNDING PROJECTIONS FOR 1995

14. Annex 1 provides updated projections for programme needs in 1995, as well as a forecast of income, including information on income actually received. Total income at 31 August 1995 amounted to \$ 642.2 million. General Programmes remain a high priority for UNHCR and some \$ 99.5 million in funding are still required to meet the 1995 General Programmes budgetary target. To facilitate planning and implementation of programmes until the end of the year, an early confirmation of likely further contributions would greatly assist UNHCR.

15. In regard to the Special Programmes set out in Annex 1, UNHCR at this juncture hopes still to receive some \$ 185.2 million, which however would leave a funding shortfall amounting to \$ 89.1 million for the remainder of the year. UNHCR will remain in close contact with the donor community with a view to securing further resources, most urgently for repatriation/returnee programmes offering durable solutions to some long-standing refugee situations.
